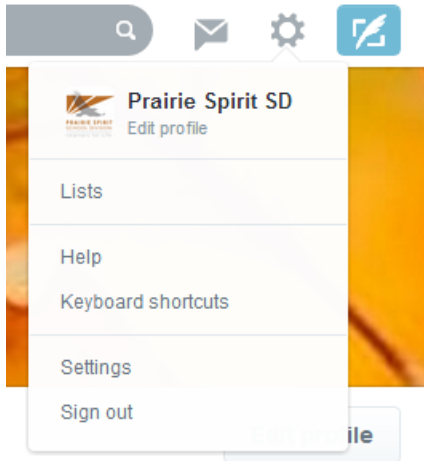




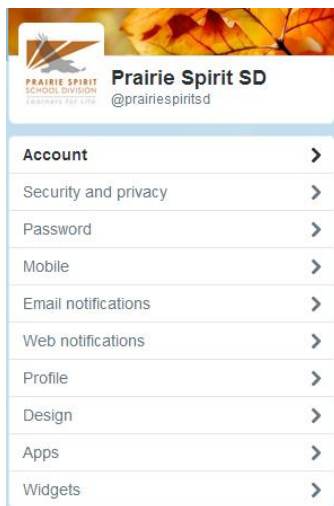
## How to add a Twitter feed to your WordPress site

1. Visit Twitter.com and log into your Twitter profile.
2. Click the gear icon in the upper right corner of the Twitter page.



3. Click on "Settings" and then choose "Widgets".



4. Choose "Create New".



5. Click on all the option tabs on the "Create a user widget" page.



- You can choose your username, the number of tweets that show up, the color of your Twitter box, the dimensions and more. Each choice that you make will be added to the HTML code for your website Twitter box.
- You can see an example of what your Twitter box will look like on the right hand side of the screen. Change the colors and size according to what will best match your website's appearance.

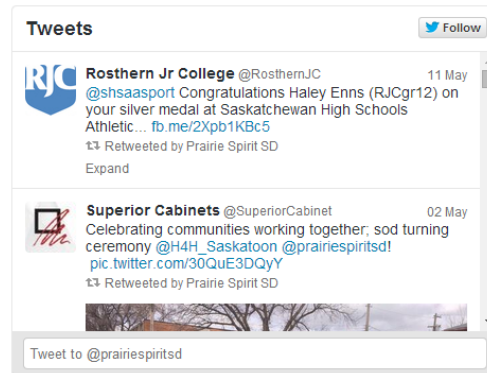

- Click "Create Widget" followed by "Save changes".
- Copy the all of the code. Be certain to get every symbol, or your Twitter feed will not work.

Copy and paste the code into the HTML of your site.

- Log into your WordPress admin page.
- Go to your WordPress dashboard and click on the "Appearance" tab. Click on the "widgets" option. Drag the Text widget box into the area of the website that you would like it to appear. Paste the HTML code into the text widget.

You can also choose to paste this code into other widgets such as a specialized WordPress plugin or even within the body of a blog post if you so desire. Once you have the code for your feed, where you place it is up to you.
