STUDENT HEALTH & SAFETY

For Aberdeen School, part of Prairie Spirit School Division, the safety of our students is our top priority. Our school partners with parents and caregivers work to support and protect our students. There has been a lot of attention on the news and through social media recently about online safety for youth. Parents and caregivers may have concerns and questions about keeping children safe online.

There are a number of strategies in place in our school and in our Division to protect and prepare our students with regards to digital citizenship and online safety. Led by our Division's Caring, Healthy and Safe School team, these strategies include:

- IT Department monitoring internet usage in Prairie Spirit schools, with a focus on security and privacy
- Division supporting student-led peer mentoring program
- Students learning about digital citizenship through the Saskatchewan curriculum
- Sharing Media Smarts information with parents and guardians, as they are a trusted resource regarding digital and media literacy - from PSSD Caring, Healthy and Safe School team

RCMP Online Safety Messages

The following online safety messages for students and parents/guardians are provided by the Saskatchewan RCMP:

Students

- \cdot Be careful of giving out too much personal information and remember that the information that you put on your profile can be seen by everyone, even if your account/profile is set to private. Your personal information/ image(s) may be used in ways that you never intended.
- Photos posted online are not private property and anything you upload online can be shared by others, potentially with thousands of people, within hours of your posting. It's also easy to alter an image using photo editing software
- Remember that once you post something online, you can't control who that information is shared with and removing it from wherever you posted it doesn't permanently remove it from the internet.
- · Tell someone, like a parent, guardian or trusted adult, if something online is making you concerned or uncomfortable. Your safety is important and an adult will be able to provide you with guidance.

Parents and guardians:

- Take an interest in what your children are doing online.
- Talk openly with your children about online safety and educate them on the risks of online interactions.
- · Activate the protection features of websites and software your children use. There are tools available through your Internet Service Provider (ISP) to help you manage your children's online experience (e.g., appropriate websites, amount of time spent online, who can and cannot contact them). It might also include other security features, such as pop-up ad blockers.
- Get to know the online environments your children use and teach them how to deal with inappropriate material.
- · Be informed about the latest methods children are using to communicate and what they're up to when they're at a friend's house.
- · Keep an eye on the sites they're visiting by keeping the computer in a common area like the kitchen.
- Report anything suspicious or concerning that your child encounters online contact your local police service or RCMP Detachment.

The track and field team will start practicing soon. Practices will run Monday through Thursday from 3:10 - 4:00 and will start on Monday, April 1st.





Counsellor's Corner—by Dede Koscielski

Bring Out Mixed Feelings

"Trying to stop impulsive behavior is like standing in front of a freight train and commanding it to stop." Neufeld suggests that when a child's behavior is driven by instinct and emotion, as behavior is when kids are upset, chances are you aren't going to change the behavior through direct confrontation. Our brains dictate how we respond to situations. When we're afraid our brain tells us to avoid, when we're insecure our brain tells us to cling and hold on, when frustrated it tells us to demand or cry or attack, and when we're shamed it tells us to hide or conceal. The brain is only doing its job causing the child to behave according to the emotions and instincts activated by a situation. Demanding that a child control themselves when they are misbehaving is asking a child to act against their natural impulses. We can help by guiding our children to experience "mixed feelings." With continued quidance, over time, children can learn to understand that we can hold many different emotions about people at the same time. We may get angry at someone we love but the love still exists. The goal is not to cut out negative feelings but to learn how to access positive emotions even during difficult situations. The parents take the lead in accepting both the negative and the positive emotions in their children as well as by helping kids make connections between negative and positive feelings. For example, a parent might say "Isn't it funny the way we can get so mad at one another but most of the time we get along great?" or "You seem to be able to do what I'm asking you now with no problem but you were mad earlier when you thought I was bossing you around." There doesn't need to be a long conversation—just point out the mixed feelings and then move on.
