<u>Discover Books for Under \$10</u> – here are a few good options. The SCC ordered *Humphry* and *Charlotte's Web* in the past, both reasonably priced on this section. The other chapter book options go up to about \$7/book (*The Bad Guys, Dragon Masters*, etc). *Pig the Pug* is a great option for littles, *The Dot* is amazing, too.

We can't guarantee to have 10 copies in May, but could try to bring in the books a couple different ways.

- 1. The Aberdeen library could choose to bring in a few copies to have on hand for that week
- 2. Community members can get library cards and request the book for the book club in advance
- 3. One of the organizers can give their library card number and have the 10 books placed on hold through that card. If they choose this option, then the organizer would be responsible for picking the books up and responsible to ensure the books are returned and not damaged.

We can't guarantee the arrival just in case the books are checked out/damaged/lost then they may not come, and because of transit times between agencies and other factors.

For book choices, Brené Brown's Rising Strong has 27 copies in the province so you may be able to bring in a few of those if that title works.
