## POST-SECONDARY OPTIONS FOR STUDENTS WHO HAVE TAKEN MODIFIED CLASSES

A student who takes modified Math, Science or English classes, at the 20 or 30 level, needs to know that this will limit their options for post-secondary programs.

If students know what they want to do after high school, check the program prerequisites and then discuss accordingly.

If a student does not know what they want to do, here are some general guidelines:

1. SASK POLY: They are still eligible to take any of the programs that ask for a grade completion and don't list any specific subjects. Check the admission requirements.

Example: Autobody Technician – Grade 10

**Educational Assistant - Grade 12** 

- 2. University of Saskatchewan: Students may be accepted with one deficiency if they clear that deficiency in the first year and if it is not a required prerequisite subject. It is best to contact the University regarding each case. Example: General Arts Degree. (Note: An average of 50% is used in admission calculation for subjects that a student is deficient in.)
- 3. Once students take 18 credit units of post-secondary education, their high school marks are not utilized.
- 4. Student can always upgrade after high school and take regular classes when they only have one subject to focus on, life distractions may be less, and they may be more focused. Sometimes when students have an end goal, they gain the motivation needed to get the regular classes.
- 5. When making this decision it is important to keep in mind why the decision is being made... are they not able to do the work for cognitive reasons or are they not able to do the work due to other factors.

  Cognitive ability will be a limiting factor.
