Old Business:

• Internet Safety Presentation for Students

• Revisiting Borden School Cell Phone policy

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• Tennis Courts situation

Village has put together a Grant Application to re-surface the area. SCC was open in principle to "chipping in" if the grant is awarded. We will find out result in December.

Fees collected this year will be spent this year. If any money is left as we approach the year end, we will plan a school event of some kind that all our students can benefit from or participate in.
