Old Business:

Christmas Banquet – feedback:

Christmas Banquet was a terrific success yet again! The student, community, and staff all enjoyed fantastic food and had the chance to connect through carols and general togetherness. Borden School needs to offer a formal thank-you to our Co-op and Ken Crush for their generous donations (see actionable item list).

• Pie Day with Seniors – feedback:

Also a very successful venture. The Seniors had positive feedback from their perspective, our students had positive feedback from their perspective, and the general comment in the room was that this was good work and worthwhile to

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continue to explore. Big thanks to Alana Gunsch for organizing and planning the first of hopefully more activities with our local Seniors and student body.

• Knowledge Keeper Survey – update:

We had 18 respondents and have compiled a working list of local knowledge keepers. We are looking to continuously add to and update our list, so there is still time for SCC members and community members to respond.

PAA Proposal – update:

Our Proposal is due to the division on January 22nd. It is simply a proposal and there are no guarantees. The stakeholders in moving PAA courses to Borden School rather than Langham have been supportive and positive. We have 16 agreements in principle from local businesses, organizations, and entrepreneurs to form partnerships for workplace and apprenticeship credits.

Parent Math Academy – update:

We are going to gather feedback on how much interest there would be from our parent community in attending a math night and also hearing what clarification or work they'd like to hear about or learn more about.

School Counselor – update and a request:

We had some clarification around the school counsellor situation at Borden School. Our school started the year without any open files for students. As files open, counsellor support will be available for our students.

The SCC also agreed to pay for (from our ministry fund) 3 staff members and 1 SCC member to attend the Educator's Conference: Brain-Based Learning, Behavioural Challenges, and Student Mental Health Conference from May 13-15.

There will be some "Go To Educator" counselling training for our staff offered in the near future. Borden School will be sending extra staff (if we can) to receive this training.

We have a day of PD being planned with Heather Wegren (Division Counsellor) to train and address questions from the staff. We will be using some of our planning days to make this work.

New Business:

Fundscrip update:

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- How to get the whole community?
- > Can be available online all the time.
- > Payout an option twice a year.
- 13 orders = \$4,100 school received a \$170 cut as a result
- First rollout not wildly successful, but is there more potential
- Easy workload for potentially big pay-off

The first run of Fundscrip may not have been overly productive, but there are some positive signs – notably the convenience and year-round availability. Concerns around promoting consumerism were brought forward, and families/individuals were encouraged to make decisions to support only how and when they feel comfortable and confident for the program being used.

2 Trustees have resigned, so our current board is shifting responsibilities around so that all students, communities, and schools still have a trustee looking out for them.
