It is almost that time of year where people across Saskatchewan come together to celebrate a longstanding tradition of giving and supporting our own! Yes!! It is almost Telemiracle Time!!



Even though our annual show will look a bit different (due to Covid restrictions and guidelines) the **SHOW WILL INDEED GO ON**! Kinsmen and Kinette clubs from across SK will be hosting Telemiracle 45 in Saskatoon on **Feb.27/28th, 2021**. The show will feature a more virtual format with pre-recorded performances and unfortunately, will not have a live audience present.

<u>Telemiracle recipients need our support now, more than ever before!</u> Just because we are all impacted by Covid, it does not mean that the need for medical equipment, supplies, or essential travel costs for medical treatment, just goes away. The needs are still there. So many people need our help.

The winners of this contest will have their video shown at the show, and also on the website.

Our involvement doesn't stop there! This year, Mrs. Troupe-Logue is the Telemiracle 45 Education Chair for the planning committee, and she is gathering **audio recordings of students** from classrooms across SK, shouting out 'numbers' that can be used to generate the 'totals' for the show. Borden School student voices will be taking part! Due to Covid, Telemiracle is not allowed to have students come to the show and hold toteboard numbers on stage, as we have done so in the past. Schools will be allowed to make a video recording of a student presentation of our fundraising total and send this in to be a part of a virtual 'online' presentation to the national staff on the stage during the show. This replaces the 'walk on presentations' at the stage during the course of the show.

Did you know that **one of the performing acts at Telemiracle this year is a local Borden band?** ---Putt Putt's Garage will be performing as part of the Saskatchewan talent! This is very exciting!
