#### Mental Health Information and Resources:

Carmelle Blomquist was introduced above. Carmelle is happy and eager to work with students and families across all grades. If you would like to connect with Carmelle, please do not hesitate to reach out to the school.

Carmelle has compiled the following resources for families as well.

## 1. <u>Stress Strategies</u>

In addition to the information and interventions for managing stress provided on the main page, the Resources tab (found lower on the main page) links to an extensive and excellent list of primarily Canadian resources.

2. <u>Stressed Teens</u>

An online resource featuring the benefits of mindfulness in managing stress. The toolbox includes several activities, videos and suggestions for mindful interventions.

## 3. <u>Kids Help Phone</u> **1-800-668-6868**

Provides direct and immediate access to text/message and phone crisis support. The site contains tons of information about numerous issues such as: depression, ADD/ADHD, body image, gender identity.

4. Family Service Saskatoon

Provides access to youth, couples, families, group and individual counselling and support services.

5. <u>Catholic Family Service Saskatoon</u>

Delivers information, programming and counselling support for kids, teens, adults experiencing family and personal difficulties.

6. Sask First Responders Mental Health

Provides contact information for immediate assistance with mental health crises.

# **Parent Volunteers:**

Recently information was shared regarding parent volunteers at the school. Although there are criteria for parents to volunteer, we are really craving that connection with our community and families. We encourage folks to get engaged. We look forward to having parents in the school more frequently again! # Dressing for the Weather:

So far, we have enjoyed a mild start to winter. Moving ahead, we can anticipate that weather will continue to get colder. It is important that all students (K-6) dress appropriately for the weather (suitable jacket/parka, boots, ski-pants, toque, mitts, scarves, etc.). Also, all students who ride the bus (K-12) need to be dressed for the weather.

As a school, we move recess breaks indoors for K-6 when the weather is too cold. We use the temperature of -27°c as a benchmark to determine if a recess break will be outside or inside. There is an element of professional judgement too, as -27°c on a calm, windless day is quite different from a blustery and windy -27°c or lower. It has also happened in the past when the AM recess has been indoors, but the PM recess has been outdoors as the weather changed throughout the day. If an outside recess determination is made (it is announced prior to recess breaks on days when it is an issue), we expect all students in K-6 to be able to go outside. Students who are unable to go outside because of unsuitable clothing put a strain on the supervision of students (having students in too many places for the number of adults who are required to supervise). Your understanding and support in this area is greatly appreciated. If you would like to speak more about this, please reach out to the school.

### **PowerSchool Parent Portal:**

For students and families from Grades 7-12, the PowerSchool Parent Portal will be open from December 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>. These dates are a little bit past the halfway point of Quarter #2.

As a school, we are continuing to evolve our assessment practice from the traditional model of task completion to more of a holistic approach of evidence collection. The shift in assessment means that Gradebooks are more organic as the evidence provided deepens or changes. By opening the portal at specific moments, it provides the staff the time to collect evidence fully and apply their professional judgement (based on evidence) while determining achievement scores.

As a result of this evolution, Gradebook achievement scores may adjust as more evidence is collated. I have decided that having the portal open for windows of time would be better than having the portal open all the time and potentially causing confusion or distraction if/when the adjustments are applied and entered into PowerSchool.

## Curling:

Curling season is upon us! The grade 7 - 12 students will have the opportunity to participate in curling this year. The practices will be split into junior (grade 7/8) and senior (grade 9 - 12) and we will practice out of the Radisson curling rink.

Some students have already signed up, but if you want your child to join the team, please talk with them and let Mrs. Martell know.

Practices will start in December – a schedule will be sent out once the practice times are finalized. Students are expected to find their own transportation to and from practice.

Students with their drivers' licenses are able to drive themselves (and siblings if applicable) to practice.
