Colonsay School Student Code of Conduct

Guiding Principles

1. Discipline needs to be a process of instruction that teaches the attitudes, knowledge and skills necessary for individuals to develop self-control. This requires students to learn to make appropriate choices.
2. Consequences need to be logical and natural in nature, and related to the expected behaviours.
3. The teacher, often in consultation with students, will develop appropriate classroom rules and expectations. While these may be unique for every class, they will be consistent.
4. The development of self-discipline and responsible behaviour is our desired goal.

Expectations

The staff of Colonsay School has the following expectations: Students will:

1. Conform to the rules of the school.
2. Observe established standards of cleanliness, tidiness, deportment and dress code.
3. Show courtesy, respect and consideration for all others. Examples include respecting personal space, property and feelings of others.
4. Behave responsibly and accept responsibility for their actions.
5. Be diligent in their studies.
6. Attend school regularly and in a punctual manner.
7. Provide self with supplies needed for studies.

Students are reminded that they are responsible to the principal from the time they leave for school to the time they arrive home after school and are responsible to any staff member at any time anywhere on the school premises or during a school function or event. Wide ranging consequences may be applied depending on the severity of the incident and the frequency of the misbehaviour. Effective discipline also requires the cooperation and support of the home. Parents will be notified and included in the discipline process.

Colonsay School Strategy for a Safe School

Role of Parents

The following are helpful practices parents can engage in to keep Colonsay School a safe and respectful environment for all.

1. Know and support the Colonsay School Student Code of Conduct.
2. Learn about bullying behaviors and discuss these with your child.
3. Encourage non-aggressive ways of resolving conflict.
4. Promptly inform the school if bullying or inappropriate behaviour is suspected.
5. Watch for signs of distress in your child.
6. Advise your child to tell his/her teacher or principal about bullying incidents.
7. Participate in school meetings if requested.

Role of Students

1. Refuse to be involved in generally inappropriate acts or specific acts of bullying.
2. Speak out against bullying.
3. Report incidence of bullying or suspected incidence of bullying to a parent, teacher or the administration.
4. Get help from an adult.
5. Participate in school bullying awareness programs when possible.

Role of Staff Members

1. Understand, model and promote the Colonsay School Student Code of Conduct.
2. Be role models in words and actions.
3. Be observant of signs of distress or suspected incidents of bullying.
4. Be prompt and visible while supervising students.
5. Raise awareness amongst pupils about bullying behaviors.
6. Listen actively to a student-reported incidence of bullying.
7. Intervene quietly and calmly to incidents of bullying and misbehavior.
8. Report bullying incidences to homeroom teachers and the administration.
9. Support and promote initiatives and programs in the school to combat bullying.

Grade 12 Graduation Requirements

24 credits are required to receive senior matriculation. A minimum of 8 credits are required to have completed standing at the grade 10 level and 16 at the grade 11 level. A minimum of 24 credits is required to graduate, 5 of which must be at the grade 12 level. Courses can be regular (10, 20, 30), modified (11, 21, 31), or alternate (18, 28, 38).

Students may also take elective courses by distance education. These are delivered online. See the principal for details.

Spares: Students in grade 10 are required to carry a full load of classes. Grade 11 and 12 students may have one spare. Grade 12 students may have the option of a second spare. The principal must approve all program changes. Students need to check post-secondary programs for grade 12 course entrance requirements. Many high school courses have prerequisites as well. Planning must begin in grade ten. See your principal for advice.

Graduation

The date for the 2017 graduation exercises will be set in the fall. Colonsay School is responsible for the exercises, which are held in the school gymnasium in the evening. Parents and grads are responsible for the banquet, pictures and inviting guests to the banquet.

Colonsay School Policies and Definitions

Academic Standing

Students in "Good Academic Standing" will enjoy all of the privileges available to students of Colonsay School. Students who are in "Poor Academic Standing" will be assigned to the homework room and lose off-campus privileges. Other consequences may be applied for students who remain in poor academic standing.

Accidents

All accidents that occur during school events or instruction will be reported to the administration. A report will be completed stating the particulars of the accident. Parents will be notified as soon as possible. The PSSD has an insurance carrier that can provide parents with accident insurance for their child.

Assessment

Colonsay School believes that grades should reflect evidence of learning. As such, academic and behavioral outcomes are reported separately.

Guiding Principles

1. Academic and behavioral outcomes are equally important.
2. Every situation should be treated uniquely to support academic achievement.
3. Assessment is a continuous process.

Awards

As reporting practice continue to evolve, so too will our Awards Program. The following awards will be presented in June at our Awards Celebration, although the traditional format in which these awards have been presented may be altered:

- **Grade 7/8 Achievement Awards:** Students who have consistently met or exceeded curricular standards and have maintained an overall average of 3.0 or higher.
- **Academic Proficiency Awards (9-12):** The student who achieves the highest overall average in a specific English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science or Social Studies course.
- **Most Improved Student Awards (10-12):** The student who demonstrates the most academic growth from one school year to the next based on his or her overall average.
- **Honour Roll (9-12):** Students who maintain an overall average above 80%.
- **Principal's List (9-12):** Students who maintain an overall average above 90%.
- **Sports Awards:** Students who demonstrate strong athleticism, leadership, and sportsmanship. The coaches choose these awards.
- **Athlete of the Year Awards:** The student who participates in a variety of activities and best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship and athletic achievement.
- **Citizenship Awards:** The student who demonstrates good stewardship to teachers and peers, seeks to improve his/her school community, and contributes to extra-curr initiatives.

Band

The PSSD has an itinerant band instructor who travels to the school two days in the cycle. The program is offered to grade 5 to 12 students. Students may join the beginner program in grade 5 and progress to the advanced and senior band. Students are graded and receive report card marks and earn credits for grades 10 to 12. More information about the band program can be obtained from the band teacher, Mr. Will Martin (will.martin@spiritsd.ca).

Bullying

Definition: A person is bullied when he/she is exposed repeatedly over time to intentional negative actions on the part of one or more persons.

1. Bullying is intentional.
2. Bullying is repetitive.
3. Bullying is an attempt to inflict injury or humiliation.
4. Bullying may be physical, verbal, social, or psychological.

Examples of bullying include but are not limited to the following.

1. Physical: hitting, spitting, pushing, kicking, stealing, threatening, tripping, taking objects from someone, not adhering to the hands off policy
2. Verbal: insults, rumors, teasing, name-calling, put-downs, swearing, lying, ridicule
3. Social: exclusion, public humiliation, notes, graffiti
4. Psychological: dirty looks, body gestures, rolling eyes, facial expressions

Concerns

To ensure a high quality of education, the staff of Colonsay School welcomes constructive criticism. To guarantee your comments are dealt with immediately, we invite you to please discuss your concerns in the following sequential fashion:

1. Teacher
2. Principal
3. Superintendent of Schools or Director of Education

Dress Code

Parents and students are reminded that Colonsay School is an academic institution. Therefore any clothing or school accessories that contain printed material must be of an appropriate nature. Students in grades 5 - 12 are to have gym clothing.

1. Student should dress with professionalism in mind for school and all school functions. This includes coming to school for report cards, refunds, returning of books, etc.
2. Shoes should be worn at all times.
3. Gym clothing must be available to each student. **Non-marking runners are a necessity.**

Driver Training

Driver Training is offered by Precision Driving School, instructor Todd Pluhator. Students are eligible if born on or before December 31, 2001. Mr. Pluhator can be reached by phone at 306-955-5680.

Driving

Students are not permitted to drive during breaks without permission from a staff member. For insurance and liability purposes students are not to transport other students during school hours or for school sponsored activities. Failure to abide by these guidelines will initiate consequences ranging from a phone call home, confiscation of keys, loss of driving privileges or suspension. Parents are reminded to complete the volunteer driver form if they are driving students for school events.

Extracurricular Activities

Extracurricular activities such as athletics, drama, SADD and SRC are an important part of the school programming and are offered in grades 7 to 12 when adequate interest and supervision is available. Students are expected to maintain the appropriate academic performance to participate in extracurricular programs.

Fire drills

Fire exits are posted in each room. Students are to leave the room in single file and assemble at the predetermined area for roll call.

Footwear

All students are expected to wear appropriate footwear in the school and remove dirty or wet footwear. For that reason it is important to have a second pair of shoes that are at school.

Internet

The Internet offers vast, diverse and unique resources to students, teachers and parents. Internet access is provided to students for educational purposes. Students are responsible for the appropriate use of the Internet and technology. Inappropriate use may result in a suspension of computer privileges. Students are encouraged to bring their personal wireless devices for use in class.

1. The computers and Internet are primarily for academic purposes.
2. Students must not access inappropriate sites. If an inappropriate site is accessed accidentally, students should report it to the teacher immediately.
3. Damaged or malfunctioning equipment should be reported immediately.
4. Students will respect the privacy of others.

Kindergarten

Students are eligible to register for Kindergarten enrolment if they are five years of age as of December 31. Kindergarten will be on odd school days for 2016-17.

Late Assignments

Students should make arrangements with their teacher if an assignment is going to be late. In order to complete assignments, students may be assigned to the homework room, or make other arrangements with their teachers. Students with several outstanding assignments will be considered to be in poor academic standing and interventions will be applied. In credit programs, assignments must be completed in order to receive credit. If students are unable to complete the work prior to the end of the course, credit will be withheld.

Lockers

The lockers are the property of the school. They will be treated with respect and may be inspected at any time. Students should lock their locker to insure the security of their supplies. Items are not to be left in the hallway, entrances, or other public areas.

Off-Campus Policy

Colonsay School believes that students should use their spares to prepare for their classes, complete homework, and study for exams. Students in good academic standing will be permitted to leave the school, provided they have parental permission. Students in poor academic standing will be assigned to a classroom.

Servery

Volunteers operate the Servery as a service to students and profits go directly to students through the SRC. A variety of food is available. A policy governs the operation of the Servery. Colonsay School offers nutritious choices in the Servery and we ask that parents do the same.

Telephone Use and Cellular Phones

No unauthorized long distant phone calls are to be made from the school. A student phone is provided for use during breaks. Students are to use any cellular devices in Colonsay School in a responsible manner during lunch and breaks only, unless approved by a staff member.

Tobacco and Cessation Devices

Tobacco products, tobacco replacement products, and tobacco cessation devices (including, but not limited to, vaporizers and e-cigarettes) are not permitted on school grounds.

Weather and Busing

The PSSD has a weather busing policy. The bus driver is responsible for the decision not to run their bus. Safety is the first concern. The guideline established by PSSD is to not run the buses if the combined temperature and wind chill are minus 40 or below at 6:00 am. The school will remain open. If the bus does not run in the morning due to inclement weather, it will not run in the afternoon. Parents should ensure that students are dressed appropriately for weather conditions.

Work Experience

Work Experience is a credit course offered to grade eleven and twelve students in both semesters. Students gain work place experience at a placement of interest. The students spend one week each semester at a work placement as well as completing an in class component. Work Experience will next be offered in the 2017-18 school year.
