#### Teachers Report - Barb Kielo - Health Promoting Schools (HPS), Career Counselling

- **HPS = Health Promoting Schools** Pillar → Healthy Eating

Problem: Lots of students don't eat breakfast (no time, not hungry, or they ate breakfast so long ago they are hungry now). Brains need food to function.

Solution: Provide a healthy morning snack twice a week... Tuesday and Thursday.

Baking: healthy options prepared by lifeskills & volunteer parents

Fruit: donated each week by Thomas Fresh

\*\*\* a group of volunteer students help to prepare the snack along with Mrs. Wirz, Ms. Hill-Wilcox, Ms. Traynor & Barb Kielo

Career Counselling – grades 9-12.

Main Focus: Senior Students

- Notifying students and parents of Career Exploration Activities. Ex.: Open Houses, SIEC Events, Career Fairs, etc.
- Helping students explore their options and make career plans for their future. Barb interviews all Grade 10-12 students every year to get an idea of what their plans are after highschool and what she can assist them with
- Helping students apply to post-secondary institutes
- Helping students find & apply for scholarship/bursary opportunities

- Organize & recruit local awards Currently 15 local scholarships/bursaries exist that total over \$12,000 annually.
- Timetabling
- Registration of new students
- Monitoring of pre-requisites & requirements for graduation.
- Every second year, Barb organizes a local career fair for our Grade 9-12 students with over 30 presenters.
- Responsible for initiating our Grade 12 Career and Work Exploration Program where Grade 12's are given the opportunity to experience a career that they would not have the option of doing on their own.
- Ex: radio stations, positions at the university, vets, jobs in the trades, massage therapy, paramedic, etc.
- Do all the work organizing this at the school level, facilitate the in-class portion and help supervise the week that they are out.
- Organize the National Event of Take Your Kid to Work Day for the Grade 9's every year.
- Make guest appearances, team teach units that involve career education.

## My Prairie Spirit Classroom

is diverse in worldview, culture, language, gender identity and interests and this is how we learn together.

In my classroom, 20% of the time consists of whole group teacher talk and 80% of the time is student talk (whole group, small group and independent self-talk).

**All** students participate in side-by-side learning opportunities with me several times a week in each subject area. Side-by-side learning opportunities include descriptive next steps feedback or reflective conversations.

My instruction includes opportunities for **all** students to construct knowledge, have choice in learning and experience explicit teaching and modelling of learning strategies that students can apply while exploring new ideas and concepts.

Learning opportunities for *all* students are characterized by high expectations (rigor), personal and purposeful application (relevance), collaborative learning environments (relationship), risk-taking to consider alternative instructional approaches (innovative) and student choice (engagement).

Formative assessment and various forms of feedback (e.g. self, peer, adult, parents) strengthen and inform my classroom practices and support *all* learners in their progress toward their learning goals.

My teaching begins with big ideas, sharing them with students and teaching and relating parts (knowledge and skills) to the big ideas throughout the learning process. **All** students understand, articulate and can provide evidence of their growth towards the big idea.

At least once a month, I have opportunities to discuss the *next steps* in my personal learning efforts. This can occur through learning walks or collaborative learning with colleagues.

RE: SCC Communications

Thank you for your email of September 23, 2015, requesting answers to questions that have arisen from your SCC's Communications Committee. Please see below:

- 1. What is the Division policy regarding school websites?
  - Who has access to make changes? Only employees of the Board can edit the primary school website. Associations, parents, students, etc., can create and edit secondary sites that the school may choose to link to.
  - What content can be placed on it? Content of the school website is at the discretion of the school principal and the staff they designate.
  - Can it include a link to a separate Delisle Composite SCC website? Yes.
- 2. What is the Division policy regarding parent email lists that the school has? Data collected by the school containing personally identifiable information cannot be shared without consent.
  - Can the Delisle Composite SCC send information directly to that list? If the parent gave
    the data to the school with that expectation, then yes. Another option would be for the
    SCC to provide the information to the school for distribution.
- 3. What is the Division policy regarding texting?
  - Does the Division have a text notification system to send bulk messages to parents?
     We have an alert system that schools use to send automated texts, emails and phone calls. This has not been implemented in all schools, but is being rolled out gradually

across the school division. The school principal would determine what is sent through the alert system. Parents identify the method of communication by which they prefer to be notified. Not all parents have or identify texting as an option.

- Can Delisle Composite School (or SCC) develop its own text notification system for parents? There is nothing stopping anyone from setting up such a system, but it is recommended that you consult with people about how they best want to be communicated with.
- 4. What is the Division policy regarding social media? Social media sites like Facebook and Twitter are fine. They should not be used for commercial purposes or self-promotion. Social media sites that represent the school need to be under the control of the school.
  - Can a school or SCC develop its own Facebook page? Yes.

## WEBSITE:

You stated that "Only employees of the Board can edit the primary school website"

So in the case of Delisle Comp. I assume the following link would be the primary website.

Most of the information on it is over one year old, and we would like the website updated.

I understand the school principal has added a few events to the calendar recently,

Andrew MacKenzie (our schools webmaster) is working directly with the principal and a teacher at DCS to maintain the site. It was handed over to the school in August. The site will be updated regularly.

1) Are the administration & teachers at the school the "employees of the Board" that can edit the site?

Yes, the administration, the teachers as well as their assigned tech support.

2) If so, what website training, support, etc is there available, from PSSD to the school staff that are

responsible for maintaining the website site?

Andrew MacKenzie works one-on-one with staff at schools to assist with maintaining their websites. In some cases he maintains the site for the school if requested.

3) Can the SCC arrange to bring such training to our school staff ourselves?

What about other similar technology training for the staff? (i.e. training the administrative assistant how to create a pdf. document to email to parents)

Each school has an assigned technician. We assist schools with any technology needs they identify including training on systems as required. The SCC could work with the school administration to identify such training needs.

I would suggest contacting the school division tech team first to see if we can provide the training they seek as we are readily available and hope to be that first line of contact and support to schools.

I ask the above questions, because, like many places, the level of experience with technology seems to not only vary greatly between staff members at the school, but also seems lower overall than one might want.

We feel improving staff knowledge in this area would not only improve the school's communication with the outside world, but also staff interactions with students.\
We agree and are very pleased provide training and support as needed.
Please let us know what is required and we will respond promptly.

We would like to learn more about the 'alert system'.

- 1) Has the alert system been implemented at Delisle Comp? Yes, the alert system has been implemented at DCS.
- 2) If not, how/when could we get it done?
- 3) Is it only intended for emergency (lockdown) sort of situations, or for general communications or both? It is available to the school administration to use as they require. It can be used to send any type of communication but each school guards the overuse of such systems because of the null effect they can have if overused or if used for ordinary purpose.
