

School Goals 2023-2024



Yearbook



The Black team won the Colonsay tournament and played really well at the DCS Senior Girls home tournament. Senior Boys volleyball: There was not a formal junior boys team so five grade 9 players competed with the seniors this year: Austin, James, Hunter, Noah, and Paul. We recruited three more to come out (Spencer, Eli, Grayson) to participate in Clavet for the CVAC junior playoff experience.

The senior boys team combined forces with Asquith again this fall (we are in the 2nd year of a 3 year commitment through SHSAA) to field a team. We tend to be short in numbers for boys volleyball, but this fall we had quite a few new players come out and included any grade 9s that wanted to play too! We had a busy

season and ran two teams. We competed in tournaments in Dalmeny, Clavet, Rosetown, Biggar; we played multiple exhibition games; and we held a successful home tournament. There was an upswing in boys volleyball throughout the province as there were enough teams to warrant Conference playoffs this fall (the last two years we went straight to Regionals.) The top 2 teams advanced from round robin play in Outlook, and despite beating Rosetown and going to 3 sets against Clavet, we lost to Outlook and didn't move on. 
Eli qualitifed for Provincial Meet held in Regina on Oct 14 placing 83rd in the province. Great job all!
