Quarter 3 activities and community-building!



On March 19, ELA B10 partook in a video conference to learn about resistance and survival in the Holocaust from @liberation.75 as part of Holocaust Remembrance Day. The second trimester group of grade 8 PAA built and raced their CO2 cars through the halls using SIEC (Saskatoon Industry Education Council) kits. The project gives students drafting and carpentry experience as they transform a piece of wood into a race car. Then using CO2 cartridges, they race and see their design decisions come to life.

In February, the grade 9 classes participated in a virtual P.A.R.T.Y. workshop (Prevent Alcohol and Risk-related Trauma in Youth) through the Sask Health Authority. There were really impactful sessions including paramedic, occupational therapist, and survivor stories.





Ms. Hill and the Outdoor Education 20 class spent the winter months snowshoeing and exploring the evolution of winter dormancy. Some days, just enjoying the sunshine on their faces! The Nisbet snowshoeing trip fell on a bitter cold day but students were troopers and enjoyed strolling through

the forest. They've patiently waited for the snow to melt to continue exploring our ecosystem. Now with the warmer weather, they are busy investigating soil, water, and prepping plants for their Garden project. Can't wait for the next field trip in May to explore sand dune ecology!







We had a "Meme-Hunt" activity in our family liaison time on the last day before break. Students were given meme clues for locations in the school, looked for answers to a riddle at each place, and put their completed sheet in a draw for prizes all day long! Lots of fun!




