We are using the Edsby app for communication, attendance and reporting student progress. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we learn along side families this new tool.

Attendance:

If you are child will be absent from school, please let your child's teacher and /or the office know so we can enter it accordingly and to prevent unnecessary call outs from our attendance management system. Our attendance notification system will reach out to primary caregivers of students after 9:30am by email, text and automated phone calls to student's who are absent for an unknown reason. Absences can also be notified to school staff through the Edsby app. Phone messages can be left on the school's message manager advising of absences. The school can be reached at 306-493-2451. Medical Information:

If your child has an allergy or medical condition we should be aware of—please let their classroom teacher know or contact the office so that in the event of an emergency situation we are able to act quickly and efficiently.

Error in small agendas:

The smaller agenda, the division II book has an error in December. It states no classes on Wednesday, December 21st—<u>there is in fact classes that day</u>. Christmas Break begins on Friday, December 23rd so the last day of classes for the calendar year is Thursday, December 22nd. Our apologies for the confusion.

Billets:

We would like each family to have someone listed as their billet. A billet is someone who lives in the town of Delisle that would be responsible to take your child in the event of an emergency such as inclement weather or water disruption and the school had to close. A billet does not have to have a child attending DES. We ask that even town families have a billet on file in the event parents or caregivers were not available. It is rare that these instances happen but in the event of an emergency it saves precious time if we have plans already in place. If you have questions about this—please speak to one of our administrators.

Communication:

Future newsletters and most communication will be sent home electronically to families to the primary caregivers of each student. If your family would like to receive newsletters and communications in paper format—please let your child's teacher know or contact the office. If you are aware of a family that is not currently getting our school communications—please tell them to let us know so we can ensure we have their contact information correct in our new Student Information System, Edsby.

Your help may be shelving library books, reading with students or taking materials home to cut out, sort or organize. Volunteers working directly with students would need to have a criminal record check completed and placed on file with the school. Prairie Spirit School Division Bus Garage is located in Warman and plans and manages the bussing for the entire school division. They use an app called **MyStop** that allows families to track their bus when en-route to guage delays or disruptions. The app also allows drivers to send "push notifications" to families phones if the bus route has been cancelled for such reasons as weather or break downs. MyStop is free to use for all smart phones and android phones. Once you have downloaded the app, please remember to choose "allow push notifications" so you receive those alerts.
