Grady is a typical 1st born; he never wants to make a mistake. School has always been easy for Grady but as a parent, I would like him to push himself more and be more creative. His marks are great, and teachers love him but as a middle child myself, this drives me crazy.

Isla is the complete opposite, the second born, she leads with her heart, doesn't use her head, learns from her mistakes... sometimes, and is a lot like her father. This also drives me crazy. Just like it drove my parents crazy. Isla has found the structure of the school more difficult and as parents, we have struggled with Isla. What I want her teachers to know is how creative she is. When she was younger, she could make anything out of a cardboard box. It made a huge mess but we always admired how she could critically think. It never was perfect or pretty but always worked for her. Now she doesn't build stuff for her toys, she creates whatever for her

younger sister.

Lawson... is a good mix of both, I guess being 10 and 8 years younger, she has had a lot of time to learn from her older siblings. She picks stuff up pretty quickly like her brother but loves art projects like her sister. Seeing that we have always dragged her to everything of the older two and she went through two years of a pandemic, we do find Lawson shyer than Grady and Isla. It takes her longer to warm up to people and she gets anxious easier.

So why is this important? Three kids from the same two people, who are all vastly different. They learn differently, respond differently, and people look at them differently. However, I want them all to love school and enjoy going every day.

I take great pride in seeing how well our staff know your children. This crew here at DES goes above and beyond building relationships with our students. However, you are the experts of your children, you are their first teachers, and you know things about them we may not know yet. Sharing this with us helps us walk alongside you in their learning journey.

Kindergarten Registration:


Registration is open for children who will be five years of age before December 31, 2023. You can begin the process online at the following link—https://register.spiritsd.ca/ or get a registration form from the school.


