Well... if you are like me, you are pretty sick of this snow. There are many days I feel I am better at working with your children than I am working with my own. I just came across something in the last month that has helped me both as a parent and as a teacher. I thought I would share it with you. It is a resource I have found helpful, I am in no way saying this is for everyone, but it resonated with me.

Before I start, Kelly (my wife) and I have 3 beautiful kids, Grady, Isla, and Lawson. All three are so different. They bring so much joy to our lives but we also struggle with their choices... daily. I understand how difficult being a parent can be at times but I also understand the love that our three bring to us... daily.

Over the February break I read a book called **Daring Greatly by Brene Brown**, by read, I

mean listened to. Audible has been the best thing for me. Five minutes into an actual book and I am asleep. I actually listened to it twice, the drive from Martensville is long, so I have a lot of quiet time.

Many parts of the book hit me hard, but it was the part on "Whole-hearted Parenting" that actually got me guite emotional at times. As a person who spends his days working with children, I feel my children need to fit a certain mold. I am not sure what this is, but where I struggle is when my children make mistakes, to me, it doesn't just mean I am a bad parent, it means I am a bad educator. As I was listening to the part of the book on parenting these are the pieces that stood out for me and are helping me see what is most important in raising my kids. These are just quotes, take them as you like. So here are the three that I turn back to when I start to question what I am doing.

"Who we are and how we engage with the world are much stronger predictors of how our children will do than what we know about parenting. In terms of teaching our children to dare greatly in the "never enough" culture, the question isn't so much "Are you parenting the right way?" as it is: "Are you the adult that you want your child to grow up to be?"

"The real questions for parents should be: "Are you engaged? Are you paying attention?" If so, plan to make lots of mistakes and bad decisions. Imperfect parenting moments turn into gifts as our children watch us try to figure out what went wrong and how we can do better next time. The mandate is not to be perfect and raise happy children. Perfection doesn't exist, and I've found what makes children happy doesn't always prepare them to be courageous, engaged adults."

"You can't claim to care about the welfare of children if you are shaming other parents for the choices they're making... I've sworn off the good-bad parenting dichotomy simply because on any given day you could file me under both a good parent and a bad parent, depending on your perspective and how things are going for me."

Again, I am not sharing this to say what is right or wrong, I just got me to reflect on my perception of what we do in raising our children. I just know I have more sleepless nights worrying about my kids and hearing this has helped me to put some perspective into how I am raising Grady, Isla, and Lawson.

#### \*Kindergarten Families Only:

There are no classes this Friday, March 31st—for the Day in Lieu. Our division opts to have conferences after school hours so one day in each half of the school year. Schools decide which days they are closed. Our family of schools, Vansocy, Pike Lake, and Delisle Composite, work together to decide which day we will be closed. We make this decision based on bussing and staffing. These dates were chosen before we split our kindergarten class, and both Days in Lieu fell on Kinder ACE days. We have to ensure that each kindergarten class has the same number of scheduled days. Therefore we have switched Monday, April 3 to a Kinder ACE day. They will attend kindergarten that week on Monday, April 3rd, Tuesday, April 4th and Thursday, April 6th. The Kinder BDF group will attend on Wednesday, April 5th. If you have any questions about this—please contact the school. Bus drivers for affected kindergarten families have been notified.

#### Edsby:

We appreciate how quickly and efficiently families have taken to this new tool. Progress Reports can be accessed, absences can be entered as well as it can be used as a communication tool between home and school. We also appreciate your patience as we learn and navigate it along side you. If you have any issues or haven't yet logged in with it or would like more information about it—please stop in the school or contact the office.

#### Attendance:

If your child will be absent from school, their absence can be entered into Edsby. Absences can also be communicated to your child's teacher and/or the office. Once attendance is taken at school, notifications will be sent out through Edsby of all unverified absences. Phone messages can be left on the school's message manager advising of absences. #### Medical Information:

If your child has an allergy or medical condition we should be aware of—please let their classroom teacher know or contact the office so that in the event of an emergency situation we are able to act quickly and efficiently.

#### 3 Way Conferences:

If you were unable to attend the conferences at the beginning of March—please feel free to connect with your child's teacher to set up a time to have a discussion if you would like. You can call the school or email the teacher directly to schedule a time that works. Thanks to everyone who was able to attend—it was great to see you!

#### RYCOR:

We will be using a program called RYCOR to accept money from families to pay for school activity fees, Ski Trips, Hot Meals and other occurrences. The system allows you to pay with a credit card. There is a convenience fee automatically added to cover the service charge the division is assessed for transactions, however it is minimal. The system will generate a receipt immediately after payment has been made. Families can still choose to pay by cash or cheque for the costs and fees that are incurred throughout the school year. This is a new system for us to use—so we appreciate your anticipated patience as we, again, learn together. Once we have more information about RYCOR and how you can use it to make payments, we will pass that along.


