It's officially spring... let's hope I didn't jinx it, we have had snow in May.

Every month I am gifted the opportunity to write a message to our families. As I sit down my head fills with so many thoughts of what I want to say, at times, it is very difficult for me to sift through and create a clear message. With that being said, despite my stories and connections, I hope that this newsletter closes the gap and brings together the home and school and that you see how great this place is.

The last few months have been difficult for families and schools. I understand that and appreciate all of your support. Just like you, I am a parent as well and have had to organize lunches with Grandma for my daughter Lawson or rely on our teenagers to help more. With Job Action affecting our communities, at times we forget that we are together in this. Your children are our students and we all want the best for them.

A term that has been used a lot over the last few months during these negotiations has been "Classroom Complexity." I would like the opportunity to best explain this from my perspective. This isn't meant to be political or to sway opinion, but if schools are using it, I feel it is important to start a discussion on what it is. To start, I feel that schools are amazing places, DES is amazing, but I understand that everyone's experiences are different. That is okay. I know that I have been privileged to feel comfort in these buildings and not everyone feels the same. I started school as a 5-year-old, and almost 40 years later, haven't really left. However, when I think about this, what have I noticed over this time... is that schools are working to get better for ALL students.

As educators, we know more about our students than ever before. We are getting better at knowing who they are as learners and what experiences they are bringing into the classroom. I talked about this in my February message, with

Shelley Moore's description of students' identity as learners in our schools. We better understand student behavior, trauma, environment, student mental health, and children's intellectual needs. Teachers work to address these all while students learn how to read, regulate, work with numbers, and be good friends. Like anything, progress is great. I believe that when we know better, we can do better. However, now that we know more, this has made our classrooms more diverse than ever and in some cases quite large. Throw in students from many different backgrounds, and implications of technology and social media... I hear the word skibbity a million times a day and the complexities I struggle with as a parent, I struggle with as a teacher. So many times I have heard how kids are different today than when we were in school...

From my experience, as educators, we feel all that we have learned over the years helps us in our rooms, where we are struggling and what makes this complex, is the structures of these classrooms have not changed. The teaching has... the setup and support hasn't. We use current best practices in our rooms to address student needs and access support from people in our division to help our teachers grow and create the best environments to learn, but this also requires time and funding.

The people in this building are terrific at what they do. They give huge pieces of themselves because they love seeing the joy of learning and care about your children. They want an environment where all students see themselves as learners and like an out-of-shape principal, want to stay for 40-plus years.

#### Edsby:

We continue to use Edsby as a communication tool as well as for attendance notifications and sharing student progress reports. If you have any issues or haven't yet logged in with Edsby, or would like more information about it—please stop in or contact the office.

#### Attendance:

If your child will be absent from school, their absence can be entered into Edsby. Absences can also be communicated to your child's teacher and/or the office. Once attendance is taken at school, notifications will be sent out through Edsby of all unverified absences. Phone messages can be left on the school's message manager advising of absences. #### Medical Information:

If your child has an allergy or medical condition we should be aware of—please let their classroom teacher know or contact the office so that in the event of an emergency situation we are able to act quickly and efficiently.

#### Media Consent:

All schools require each student to have a media consent on file. It needs to be completed once and will remain on the student's profile until they are no longer a student in Prairie Spirit School Division or families would like to change consent on the form. If you have not completed this, please fill out the form and return to school. Any new registrations going forward, this consent is built in to the registration process. The consent form is used regarding images and/or names of students shared with the public, possibly through school division publications, media coverage, video coverage, or on websites. Further details and descriptions are listed on the Consent Form.

#### Counselor:

#### Volunteerism:

#### Fees:

We are planning Field Trips and activities—we would like to remind families that we make these possible by the activity fee collected. Reminder that fees are due for student's supplies and activity fees for the school year. Fees are \$55 for students in grades 1—6 and \$40 for kindergarten students. Fees can be sent in your child's agenda as cash, cheque, or money order and receipts will be sent home. Fees can also be paid online through Rycor with a credit card. 




