Happy Spring Delisle Elementary Families

Spring is officially here, I live north of the city and the rain was welcomed in the area where I live. Everything is so green and full of life. The same in our schools. This is a very busy time. Ten months seem to come and go very quickly, but for our learners, it can seem very long. I spent many of my teaching years in the high school setting, with finals, finishing assignments, and for some students thinking about what lies ahead, June becomes very stressful. I say this because, at a time when we see more sunlight with longer days and extra activities outside, we think we should be more energized seeing the finish line. My experience as a parent and in schools tells me the opposite. At home, my kids are tired and longing for a break, I see it in our students as well. I don't look forward to the end of this year, but I love the reset we get in July and August.

I want to share some of our successes with you from this year. Our goal was support our students in their foundational skills in Literacy. As a staff, our adult learning was directed to improve our knowledge and teaching practice to improve on the explicit teaching of reading. Our staff jumped into using a program called UFLI (University of Florida Literacy Institute) as support. We assessed our students multiple times throughout the year using a Phonics Screener that allowed us to see areas of strength and areas where students need a bit more time. All staff supported readers in their classrooms and in small groups when needed. We understand that before we can ask our students to comprehend what they are reading, they need to be very proficient readers. If a student is working to decode (sound out) words, it is difficult for them to understand what they are reading.

Our results... were great. Here's what happened.

- Using our screener, we could identify specific areas of student need.
- We saw growth in our students in all grades. The more proficient students, we could find ways to extend their learning. We know that all students learn at different paces.
- Our teachers are finding ways to bring in and teach the explicit teaching of reading skills

What's up for 2024-25 in Literacy? We will continue on this journey and we will look to find more ways to share what we know with our families. Our students will continue to practice these skills at all grade levels. With my Phys Ed background, I compare this to the skills we acquire in the gym. Basketball shooting is a great example. Just because someone can shoot free throws well, doesn't mean we stop practicing. The more our students are automatic with their translating words to speech, the better they will be able to understand. This year we have introduced some AI in our classes to support our students, we will continue using a program called Project Read into next year. Finally, we want to connect what we learn and share it with DCS. Learning how to read is a role we all play a part in and they are eager to learn what we have.

Have a great June... I hope to see you all at Pike Lake Pool, the Track Meet and every morning and after school.


# **DES Community Garden**



# THE POWER OF TOUCH

Touch is the first sense to develop. It helps build healthy attachment, physical health, and brain growth. Gentle touch like hugs and high-5s teach children to love, learn, and communicate.





During drop offs or pick ups give a hug to calm your child and assure them you will be back.



During bedtime routine, cuddle while you read a story. It's a great time to connect!



Start in infancy, so that gentle touch in later years will be accepted and calming during a tantrum or meltdown.




When your child shares something congratulate or comfort them with words and touch like a hug, backrub, or handhold.


