# October 25th, 2024

Happy Halloween DES Families,

I am loving the colours of fall, the brisk mornings and warm days, although I am cautiously optimistic at any sign of moisture, because it will bring the snow. Now I actually love the snow and really enjoy winter, when it is mild and we can be outside, but the first dump of snow always makes me a little apprehensive.

A few phrases I find myself using more and regarding the work we do at the school are, "school is not the same as it was when we were students," and "as we continue to know and learn more, we can work to do better." This builds off the quote I shared last month around not striving for perfection, but trying to get a little better everyday.

These last two months our school has been blessed to work with Kirsten Dyck. She is the PSSD Math Sector Facilitator. In other words, she is an amazing Math teacher, way smarter than me, and works with the division to help teachers become better using researched practice to support her.

My biggest learning from Kirsten was how students learn math and that they need to be able to visualize and play with numbers. For me, Math came pretty easy. I was always playing with numbers in my head. I remember sitting on a hockey bench as a kid and making connections with players numbers on the ice. This shows how good of a hockey player I was, but I remember looking at players on the ice, finding a jersey number and then looking to find patterns I could make to get to the number with the other players on the ice. This is also probably the reason, my hockey career stopped in Grade 10.

As a father, I have been working tirelessly with my 14 year old daughter, Isla, in Math. She doesn't play with numbers like me. When I tell her about it, her response usually is, "I'm not weird like you." What I am trying to say, is as teachers and caregivers, our experiences guide our perceptions. When I work with Isla, part of what I find very difficult is, she doesn't think like me, and I can't change that. So my mindset has to change. I heard this line somewhere on social media, and it shook me pretty hard, "It's not the child's responsibility to teach the parent who they are, but its the parents responsibility to learn who their child is." As I navigate my way to do

better as a parent, I understand what was good for me in learning, isn't what is best for my Isla. Although I think the way to learn should be a certain way, it isn't that way for Isla. More isn't always better.

As a grade 10 student, the Math Isla is learning and how she is assessed is different than what we do in elementary schools. I understand I have to help her with the structures of what is being taught in class, but if I hammer home and pressure her with more of that, she gets upset.... So what do we do, when we have time we just play with numbers. Things like driving to hockey practice, and when we see a license plate in front of us, we play a game of who can add the 3 digits the fastest. If she can beat me on the way to the rink, I'll buy her a Booster Juice. At home, I ask her to help me bake, and I only bring out measuring cups that will force her to add fractions. When we do math, at times she can use a calculator or at time we find objects that she can manipulate. When she has questions to finish, we both do them. Before I show her my answer, I get her to explain her answer and then I explain mine.

Why do I bring this up... First, I understand that being a parent is hard, so hard but it is amazing. I really don't know if I am doing it right, but I understand that what worked for me doesn't work for her. Second, we work together to continually do better. A lot of what Kirsten showed us and our staff are doing to support our learners, I took and did at home. It wasn't about doing more it was about doing better. Are there still tears when Isla and I finish her homework together... sometimes... but Isla usually hands me a tissue and I'm able to clean myself up pretty quickly.

Finally, I understand that our families don't have access to someone as good as Kirsten. However, please know our staff does and they are working tirelessly to become better at supporting all students. It looks different than what we did in schools, but the goal is to be just a bit better than yesterday.





In addition to that we are going to try to offer perishable pop-ups on a trial basis, to be able to offer some nutrious fresh foods!


