Hey DES families,

As a start to write this I am made aware of the huge change in weather that happened over the past week. Last Monday I was picking up jackets at recess because the students said they were too hot from running around, this past Monday was a snow day and now indoor recess. I hope everyone was successful in clearing out their snow and could get around to where they needed to go safely.

After we got the email on Sunday about the schools closing, it made me think a bit about the decision. I assume, when the division makes those decisions, they need to think about so many things, the ability to access schools, transportation, safety of staff who commute, safety of students and messaging...I'm sure the list goes on and on. When thinking of this very impactful decision, it is tough to imagine how this effected just me, when the school division is thinking about 44 schools, 11 000 students and over 700 staff.

I then start thinking about our school and classrooms, we are a great school of about 214 diverse students. Our students have some similarities, but not one of them is the same. There is so much beauty in their uniqueness and our staff know each and every child as a learner. When I look at all the great things that happen in our school and the decisions that are made by staff, we always have to take into account the others in our building and classrooms. We make decisions that support the students as individuals and know that we are in a building of many different people.

We are continuing our growth with this in our learning as well. As a staff one of our goals is to differentiate the learning in our classrooms. We want to meet students where they are at in their learning and draw connections, if we can to the curriculum for that grade. This is important when we look at our progress reports which everyone is getting next Friday through Edsby. These are snapshots of a moment in the learning process for our

learners. It is where they are right now. As we look at where they are assessed and read the comments provided by teachers, this is a snapshot of where they currently are and how they learn. The process of learning never happens in a straight line, some pieces stick with students and some take a bit longer, and that's okay.

The purpose of this progress report is what's next. We have 1/3 of the year done, how do we work together for the remaining 2/3s. This is not a comparison to others, it is a piece of the map in the journey, and we understand that this journey is different for everyone and will last well beyond their time at DES.


