Hey DES families,

I know I have said this before, but I truly am grateful to get to work with you and your kiddos every day. Thank you for trusting us with the education and well being of your children.

One of my favourite things working in a school is seeing how students work with each other. Not just in assignments and group projects, but how they sort through their differences and exist in our school with each other. All of our students bring their diverse backgrounds to our building everyday as they navigate not just learning, but also how to work through being with other people. This is one of the best pieces of public education and why I believe schools are so very important in creating a world that best resembles one that we want to live in.

One of the reasons I was drawn to teaching in the gym was because this happens so often. The many lessons sport and activity teach us I get to work with in the gym. Team works, being a good partner and opponent, self regulation, working in a group, perseverance and working through something difficult are skills that I took for granted and assumed that students just had. I started most of my teaching in High School Gyms. For the most part, students knew the structures of the gym. They could deal with winning and losing, they knew how to line up and spread out when asked and usually didn't get upset if they were on a team with out a friend. When I started teaching Elementary students, I was amazed how much I have to teach these pieces to younger students.

I think the same way when I think about our students building friendships. It should be easy to do, but when I think about it, it requires a lot of maturity. Especially if you are used to having control in how things are done. When we first sent my son to day care 13 years ago, there was a boy his age who he played hockey with.

They started out as great friends. They both liked the Oilers, playing mini sticks and other sports and were actually very much alike. Maybe too much... As the year went on, and in talking to his parents, the boys would get upset at each other often, usually over one of the boys not winning a game... and sometimes the conflict became physical.

My wife and I thought about switching day cares and keeping them apart, but we struggled with the fact that they could actually be very good with each other and had a bunch in common. So we changed our messages and worked with our son around working with his "friend" and having conversations or taking a break when he got mad. Was it perfect... nope. Did Grady always listen... nope. Did they still fight... yep. But they worked through it and now they are the best of friends.

I bring this up because, school is hard. Spaces that bring together over 200 people of any age, there is bound to be some concerns, but how would we respond as adults. How do we connect with others to better our community. We come together and offer our students grace and work to keep each other safe the best way we can. We know that our students will make mistakes and we help them through these mistakes. We don't judge them and we don't judge families. We show grace, we communicate, and we support. This is how we learn and every game on the playground, every interaction with an adult or a school mate is another learning opportunity.

As we continue to support these student in being great members of our community, please know I appreciate your support in all we are trying to do. Just a heads up, the Month of May is a big one. We will be installing our playground May 22 and 23, so if you have the time to help out, we would love to have you join us.




