

Grade Kindergarten

We have been enjoying the beautiful fall weather by getting to our forest every afternoon. In our forest we: build, climb, explore, problemsolve, have fun! We have also been enjoying science out in the forest by investigating animal habitats (northern flickladybugs, ants, learning about our own connection to animals, and learning how to be good stewards of the land by practicing the 3 Rs (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle).

In math we've been learning about patterns. We've learned that a pattern needs to have a base that repeats at least 3x and that there are many different types of patterns. We really enjoyed using bingo dabbers to make our own patterns and we like to practice extending and labelling patterns.

In Story Workshop we've been building all kinds of stories and then Ms. Martineau or Mr. Quijada scribe our ideas onto paper for us. We like creating stories about our families and animals the most!

We love going to the gym for PE with Mr. Hindmarsh--we always come back sweaty and thirsty after learning lots of fun new games and skills.

We have been working on being kind to our classmates and school peers and we have been loving our time at school together!

Grades 1/2

Happy Fall! We have been enjoying the great outdoors and all the beauty of leaves!

In both reading groups, we have been doing lots of phonemic awareness activities. We have been working on rhyming, hearing sounds at the beginning and ending of words, putting words together to make compound words, taking words apart, and for the beginning readers, we've been working on letter names and sounds a lot! If you have a beginning reader, please ask your child to show you and tell you what a slide is and how to turn that slide into a word. The kids are beginning to become experts with the Reading Horizons Program. The grade 2's are also doing slides and are working on blends in Reading Horizons. Mr. Freeden has been reading aloud Stuart Little to them too!

In Math, the grade ones continue to learn about numbers to 20. We have been talking about place value and the "houses" each digit belongs in. For exam-

ple, the number 12 has a 1 in the tens house and a 2 in the ones house. This is an important concept to learn before moving on to addition and subtraction.

In Grade 2 Math we have been working on number sense, "friendly tens", addition to ten, finding the missing addend, and reviewing counting by 2's, 5's, 10's as well as using counting on as a strategy. We have just started our subtraction to ten unit, which will last two weeks and then we will move onto addition and subtraction to 20.

We have started Writing Workshop. We worked on drawing pictures to communicate an idea, incorporating multiple colours into a picture, adding details to pictures, dictating sentences to an adult about a picture, labeling pictures and how to use invented spelling to write the sounds in words. The grade 2's have been required to do more

writing than the grade I's.

We've also started our Daily and Seasonal Changes Unit which focuses on changes as they occur daily, weekly, monthly and throughout the seasons. The unit emphasizes several key concepts such as sequencing events, identifying the days of the weeks and identifying the characteristics of seasonal changes.

In Social Studies we have continued our family unit and have been talking about diversity in family traditions, celebrations, and stories. This has also gone well with our health unit in feelings. We are currently working on self-regulation as well as growth mindset.

Fridays are always a great day in our class. Besides having the option of pizza lunch, we have Friendship Friday (where we get to read with a friend during all school reading), we have Fun Friday at the end of the day (where we get to explore and learn to play with others

in free choice time), and of course, we have our favorite subject, which is art! The students have designed a unique Elmer the Elephant (when we learned about how we are all different and unique!), created themselves as a "Smart Cookie", drew and painted a

fall farmer's field and turned themselves into scarecrows. It's been a fabulous month so far and it will only get better as we will soon get to celebrate the joy of Halloween!



Grade 3/4

Happy post thanksgiving to everyone! There is so much to be thankful for in our classroom! In math, the Grade 4s are continuing to work with Mrs. Schrader on their pattern's unit, with Mr. Quijada also providing some very engaging lessons and activities. The Grade 3s have started on their numbers to 1000 unit and continue to discover and investigate ways to display these skills in various assignments and The three literacy games. groups are in full swing as the students are getting established in their teams and working with various skills like comprehension, word detectives, phonological awareness and creating words. In our writers' workshop we are working towards increasing our skills in penman-

ship, spelling, free writing and writing structure. Our science unit is slowly coming to a close as we continue to observe our plants growth and record their progress in our seed journals. However, this means our social studies unit has kicked into full gear as we are working through our first nations content beginning with discussions and activities around the medicine wheel and treaty territory. We are also extremely excited for our field trip to Wanuskewin where we will be able to participate in various presentations and tours that ties in well with our social studies unit. Outdoor learning has been a big hit with the students as the weather has cooperated immensely with our lessons and activities. Students have created their nature journals to write in during their outside learning as well as creating, searching, and exploring nature and what is has to offer. Our Harry Potter read aloud continues to be a hit with the students and the read aloud activities are received with much excitement. This month proves to be a very busy and exciting time in our classroom, and we are looking forward to our Tri-Conferences this week. Grade 5/6

The grade 5/6 class just finished sharing some information about their family histories. It has been so interesting to hear about everyone's families. We have one more class to finish up this unit and we will be starting a science

unit. In ELA we will reading the story of Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes. Students will be learning about some world history throughout this story. In math, the grade 5's and 6's will be preparing for a test in the next

few weeks. Congratulations to everyone in the class for achieving their goals and walking or running their 5km for Step up for Mental Health.

Grade 7

The leaves have been changing quickly and Autumn is upon us! The class continues to work well. In math, we are wrapping up our first unit and will be having an exam shortly. In ELA, we have finished our thematic unit on science fiction and are moving into a novel study of The Girl that Drank the Moon. This novel study falls into the Fantasy and Fairy-tale theme. In social

studies, the class is studying global organizations (NATO, the United Nations, the Soviet Alliance, etc.). In science, the students are studying biomes,

food chains and ecosystems. Tri-conferences are the 18th an 19th. I am currently fully booked, but if you would like to discuss your child's

Grade 8

The Grade 8's have been working hard learning about art from the Canadian Arctic with a focus on Inuit artist Kenojuak Ashevak. In ELA they are reading The Outsiders and are currently creating a visual representation of the poem Nothing Gold Can Stay by Robert Frost. In Math, the grade 8's just had a quiz about type two equations. In Science, they are learning about cells,

systems and tissues. The grade 8's just finished presenting their cell models/ diagrams. In Social Studies, they are learning about differing worldviews and Canadian Identity. In Home Ec. the students are working on constructing their pajama pants, in Design Studies they have been building spaghetti bridges, and in Industrial Arts they

are designing their C02 cars. In Phys Ed. the students are working on their volleyball skills and doing some fitness testing.

In Science 9 the class has been working away at introductory chemistry.

In Social 9 the class has been learning about ancient civilizations such as Mesopotamia and have even had a chance to create their own ziggurats!

In Art 9 the class has recently

started a major photography assignment that has been a ton of fun. The students are very engaged with Art this year and are showing some real creativity.

In ELA 9 the class is about to wrap up the novel study of "A Long Way Gone" and their Book-in-a-Box project. Next up in ELA is a unit based on Mythologies and their Relevance Today.
