


Pre-Kindergarten in Prairie Spirit School Division



Pre-Kindergarten (Pre-K) is active, experiential learning through play, focused on the development of the whole child: physically, socially, emotionally, spiritually and intellectually.

Pre-K focuses on:

- fostering social development and self-esteem
- nurturing educational growth and school success
- promoting language development

The Pre-K program is designed for **three and four-year-old** children who would benefit from extra support prior to starting school. The program offers developmental opportunities and supports for children at an early age, provided by school-based staff with recommendations from Division-based staff.

Each Pre-K class has 16 spaces available and is part of the elementary school. Pre-K is led by a professional teacher who is experienced in Early Childhood Education.

Pre-K is a half-day program that follows the school year calendar, with time designated for special events and family engagement activities.

The year begins with the Pre-K teacher arranging individual visits with the child and their family.

Applying for the Pre-K program

To participate in the Pre-K program, parents must complete a Pre-K application form for their child. Application forms are available at the school and online (www.spiritsd.ca).

A school division selection committee will review the Pre-K applications received. Decisions about the class are made based on the Ministry of Education's specific criteria and the availability of spaces, while meeting the needs of the most vulnerable children first. Other determining factors that are specific to each child will also be taken into consideration.

Frequently asked questions

How is Pre-K different than preschool?

Preschool or play-school are community-driven and community funded. The Pre-Kindergarten program is entirely funded by the provincial government and administered by the local school. **There is no cost to parents for Pre-K.**

A Pre-K program has a minimum of 12 hours of instruction per week. This program is not meant to replace any preschool programs already operating in the community.

How do I know if my child qualifies?

The Pre-K program is designed for three and four-year-old children who would benefit from extra support prior to starting school. A child who has a specific challenge in the area of social, behavioral, emotional, cognitive or communicative skills will be considered.

For the 2022/23 school year, children born in 2018 or 2019 are eligible to apply for the Pre-K program at their local school. Please see the list of Pre-K programs offered in Prairie Spirit schools (below).

What is my involvement in the program as a parent?

The Pre-K teacher encourages the active involvement of family members in the classroom. The Pre-K teacher works together with families to form positive relationships that promote shared responsibility for a child's learning and development.

Parents will be invited to attend special events and family engagement activities, scheduled throughout the school year. There is no parent volunteer commitment in the classroom as there would be in a cooperative preschool program.

For more information about Pre-K, please contact your local school. All schools will plan for Pre-K applications to close by May 27.

CONSENT FOR THE USE of Third Party Web-based Applications

This form asks for your consent to allow your child to use specific Division-approved online applications/tools where consent is required to comply with our privacy expectations. These applications exist online (internet-based) and are developed and hosted by independent providers. This form will apply to situations where the student will use their regular Prairie Spirit login credentials.

Educators, students, and their families are increasingly using on-line applications to enhance instruction and communication. You are encouraged to talk to your child's teacher the specific applications/tools that they intend to use in the classroom. It is possible that the applications will be able to view student names as well as any additional data entered while using the application. In some cases, this data may be stored outside of Canada.
