We are into our last two months of the school year and learning continues to encompass Langham Elementary. As time winds down, our work around our learning goal (improving our literacy skills and mental health) perseveres.

In the last few months, we have been holding a Langham Elementary School Tournament of Books. Similar to a sporting event, two books "face off" in a head-to-head challenge. Classrooms received eight copies of picture books, which they read within the classroom and then students voted for their favorite. Winning books advanced to the next round until a winner was determined. The stories focused on supporting our Mental Health – and we were excited to crown "Beautiful Oops" by Barney Saltzberg the champion.

We kicked off May with a school-wide home reading challenge. Students received a challenge sheet last week in which they can complete tasks. The tasks earn the students a chance to win prizes – including "pop its", kites, and an eReader. We hope this is another way to encourage our students to read, read!!

### **2022-23 Classroom Placements**

A lot of time and energy goes into creating classroom lists for each school year. Class placements are a group decision made by the classroom teachers, administrators and SERT teacher. The final placement of a child is a school-based decision that is made using the following criteria:

- \* Academic needs (including program and learning environment)
- \* Social needs (ex. supportive peer relationships)
- \* Level of independence
- \* Academic diversity within each group

# **Safe Bicycling**

Your child may be going to be bicycling for the first time or hitting the road as a pro. Either way, this activity can be very risky for children and they need to become familiar with, and use, safe cycling practices.

To help prevent serious injury, teach your child the following:

#### Rules of the Road:

- ride in single file
- ride one to a bike
- always ride with traffic
- use the bell on your bicycle to alert pedestrians that you are near
- at busy corners, stop and walk your bike
- keep your eyes on the road and traffic at all times
- use hand signals to tell others what you are doing
- ride in the daytime and wear brightly coloured clothes
- if you must ride after dark, use a headlight and red rear reflector
- keep your bike in good condition

#### Always wear an approved helmet

- wear your helmet whenever you ride your bike
- wear your helmet squarely on top of your head (no more than 2 finger-widths above your eyebrows)
- your helmet should fit snug with very little movement from side to side or front to back
- you should not be able to take your helmet off when the chin strap is done up
- you should be able to put no more than our index finger between your chin and chin strap
