Please read the progress report and discuss it with your child. With the changes, please let us know if you have any questions or concerns with any aspects of the reports. We are excited to share your child's learning progress with you once again.

<u>Pedestrian Safety –</u> <u>Walking to and from School</u>

<u>Did you know</u>: Young children are not capable of understanding the dangers and do not develop the skills necessary for crossing a street safely until they are at least nine years of age.

Please look through the list of safety tips shared by CAA for pedestrians:

1. Be alert and aware of your surroundings.

2. Stop, look both ways, listen and think before safely crossing the street.

3. Ensure all vehicles come to a complete stop and make eye contact with motorist before crossing the street – never assume that they will stop.

4. Never run out in traffic or between parked cars, buses, or buildings.

5. Follow traffic signs and signals. Only cross at designated locations or crosswalks. Do not jaywalk.

6. Eliminate distractions such as using your mobile devices for texting, listening to music, social media, or gaming.

7. Avoid wearing headphones or anything that can obstruct your vision or hearing.

8. Allow for extra time to cross the street safely with older adults, individuals with mobility issues and younger children.

9. Wear reflective clothing or accessories at night to make yourself more visible.

10. Parents, caregivers, or older children should hold hands with younger children when crossing the street.
