Principal's Message

One of the most common questions I get from parents is: "What can I do to help my child succeed?" Knowing that parents have the will and desire to partner with the school for their child's success is something we as educators deeply appreciate. Although every teacher may have their own answer to that question, there is one unifying fact based answer provided by PISA:

What can parents do to help their children succeed in school?

- Fifteen-year-old students whose parents often read books with them during their first year of primary school show markedly higher scores in PISA 2009 than students whose parents read with them infrequently or not at all.
- The performance advantage among students whose parents read to them in their early school years is evident regardless of the family's socio-economic background.
- Parents' engagement with their 15-year-olds is strongly associated with better performance in PISA.

So quite simply, just being involved in your child's education will help them succeed. Reading to your children at a young age and letting them see you read fiction, non-fiction or even magazines as a part of your lifestyle will help your children succeed in school.

With this factoid in mind the SCC and teachers at LAS have been working hard to create an opportunity for our students, school and community called **One Book, One School, One Community**. The SCC has generously supplied one copy of: The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane to each family grades K-8. The purpose of this book is to bring students, teachers, parents and community together with one book. **Each day we will be asking students and parents to read a**

specific chapter (or two) which will be about 15 minutes of reading. At school, teachers will be working in class with students on activities related to what is going on in the book and tying the curriculum to “The Miraculous Journey.” Our school website (www.spiritsd.ca/las) will host a link called “**Our** Miraculous Journey” to showcase the pages being read, the activities being done and the school wide final project. There will also be constant updates through Twitter @**LordAsquith** (that you can access from our school website) that will be documenting our journey with Edward. We will be having a kick off activity for grades K-8 and an opportunity for the community to come on a learning journey with us at the end of our exploration of the book. Teachers will also be asking for parent and community partners throughout our journey.

The bottom line: All parents can help their children achieve their full potential by spending some time talking and reading with their children – even, perhaps especially, when their children are very young. Teachers, schools and education systems should explore how they can help busy parents play a more active role in their children’s education, both in and out of school.

Stay tuned for more information, and we are extremely excited to start “**Our** Miraculous Journey” after the Easter Break!

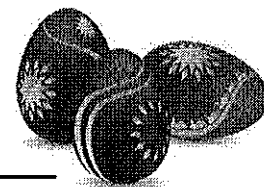

School Community Council Information for Candidates

The School Community Council is a primary link between the home, community and school. Prairie Spirit believes that involvement with School Community Councils is a rewarding and meaningful activity for parent and community members.

The purpose of School Community Councils is to:

- Support student learning success and well-being; and,
- Encourage parent and community involvement and engagement in the school.

School Community Councils provide mechanisms for parents and community members to support and influence the work of the school and to channel advice to

the Board of Education and others. The focus of the SCC is student learning and well-being. The challenge for the SCC is to engage the parents and community with the school in a meaningful partnership that supports their shared responsibility.

School Community Council responsibilities

Councils are accountable to their community. Responsibilities of the Council include:

- Understanding their community;
- Supporting parent and community involvement in the school;
- Advising the Board and school as outlined in the Board of Education School Community Council Policy;
- Working with the School to develop, support and provide advice to the Learning Improvement Plan;
- Helping parents find ways to support their children's learning;
- Reviewing extra-curricular school activities approved by the principal and Student Council members;
- Advising and approving fundraising activities in the school; and
- Reviewing student fees to ensure alignment with Board of Education directions.

Council member responsibilities

Your role as a Council member is to build shared responsibility among parents, the community and school for student learning and well-being. In addition, your role is to lead parent and community involvement in school planning and improvement.

The term of office for Representative Parent and Community Members is two years with no limit on the number of consecutive terms that may be served.

As a Council member you might expect to...

- Attend meetings from September to June as determined by the Council calendar;
- Engage in the work of the Council such as:
 - Supporting and advising the development of the Learning Improvement Plan with the staff of the school;
 - Developing, leading and taking action on Council initiatives to help families support their children's learning;

- Providing advice to the school, Board of Education and other community organizations and agencies, as outlined in Board of Education policy;
- Providing advice for school fundraising activities, school fees and the student code of conduct;
- Reporting to parents and community on Council progress; and,
- Working with other Council members to learn more about the role of the Council and how to fulfill its responsibilities.

In order to run for election to your local SCC, you must be a parent of a student in the school, or live in the school attendance area. Contact the school's principal for more details. Our School Community Council has 4 positions open for members for two-year terms beginning fall, 2014. We have 5 members who will be remaining for their second year for 2014/15.

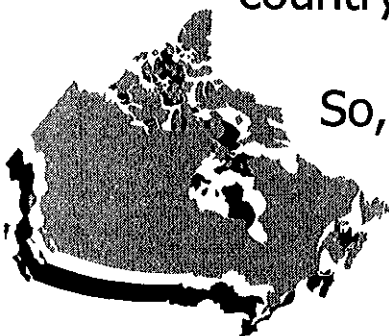

2014/15 School Year Calendar

Dear Prairie Spirit Parents and Guardians:

On behalf of Prairie Spirit School Division, I am pleased to provide the 2014/15 school year calendar. We want to thank all those staff members, parents and students who provided feedback and helped shape the development of the new calendar.

Key things to note about the 2014/15 calendar:

1. The number of instructional days (185) and the length of the school day (5 hours and 9 minutes) will remain the same as in the past year.
2. Students will begin classes on September 2, 2014, and the last day for students will be June 26, 2015.
3. Feedback from Prairie Spirit staff, parents and students strongly indicated a preference for a two-week Christmas break, a week-long break in February (including Family Day) and a 10-day break in April (including Easter).
4. Schools will continue to provide parent/teacher/student conferencing in the fall and early spring. Two additional days off for time in lieu of conferencing will be determined at the local level and communicated to you through your school's newsletter.

We believe the school calendar for 2014/15 reflects our priorities and provides a positive schedule for students, staff and families.

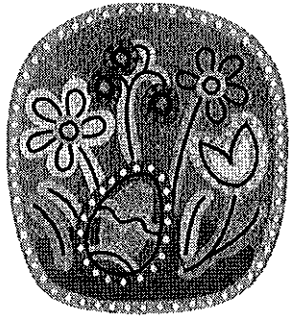
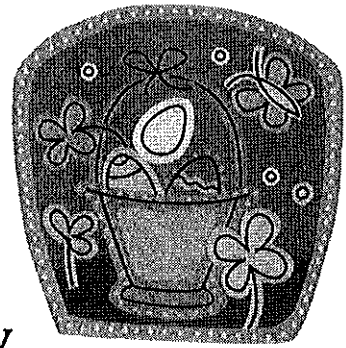

Lord Asquith School Grade 3/4 's Wish Quilt.

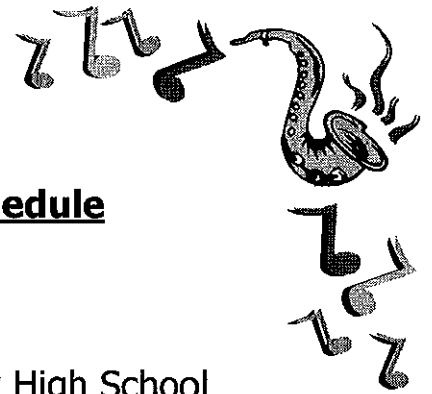
