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## Principal's Message

And here we are in the final countdown to the end of the 2015/2016 school year. Time has flown by! The 2015/2016 school year saw so many great opportunities at Lord Asquith School, everything from fantastic quality curriculum related in-class experiences to field trips K-12 to exciting presentations hosted here in the school to successful sporting opportunities and after school clubs! Although we are small, we are able to make school an exciting learning rich environment for our students because of the time, effort and creativity of our school staff, parents, and volunteers -- Thank you for your dedication to making LAS the school it is! It's that time of the year when staffing starts to be confirmed. Unfortunately, it's a little later this year because of budget complications (transfers JUST closed on Tuesday) but I can currently share information on our teachers and the classes they will be teaching.

Before I get into what our school will look like next year, I have a few announcements I need to make for this year! First of all, we are very happy to announce that Mrs. Robinson will now have a .5 permanent contract! For next year, that contract will be increased to a .7 on a temporary basis. We are very excited to have Mrs. Robinson permanently on our staff -- Welcome!

My next announcement is bitter-sweet. We will be losing Mrs. Molnar as she has accepted a new position with the Saskatchewan Teachers Federation. Although we know we will feel Mrs. Molnar's loss, we are very excited for all of the wonderful opportunities this new position will offer her! She will have the unique opportunity to work with Saskatchewan Teachers through professional development.

Due to staffing reductions, we have lost 1.3 FTE from our school which has been absorbed by: Mr. Karras & Ms. Gruending with less office time, reduction in Resource time (Mrs. Johnson will now be in Grade 5 full time) and splitting two age groupings. Our Educational Associate time has also been reduced 2.2 FTE. Our

programming and extracurricular will look different next year, so if you are ever able to lend a hand - in your students' class or coaching a team - please let us know at the school as we would be extremely grateful for your help!

Another change we are making for next year is to switch to a 6 period day of 58 minute classes in the Middle Years/High School. We are making this change to mirror what research is telling us about the crucial importance of making time for reading. More information will be coming home at the start of next year about what reading break is and why we are doing it. Our bell schedule will look like this:

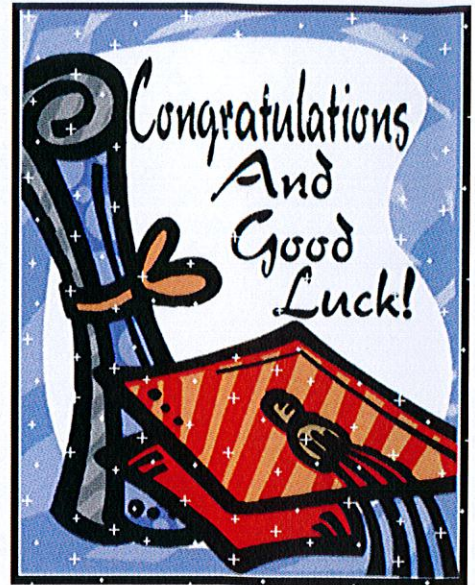

## Academics

### **ATTENTION ALL PARENTS/GUARDIANS!!!** **New Student Fee Changes for 2016/17**

There are some changes to students' fees for the 2016/17 academic year:

- Yearbook costs are going up from \$31 to **\$32**.
- Grade 12 students will be required to pay their **Basic Grad Fee (\$60)** in addition to their student fees. Banquet tickets will be available for purchase starting in May as in previous years.
- **TEXTBOOKS WILL NOT BE DISTRIBUTED AND LIBRARY PRIVILEGES WILL BE SUSPENDED** until all fees are paid.

Student fees are expected to be paid the first day of school. All outstanding fees or charges from previous school years are expected to be paid. **Please Note:** We recognize that school fees can be a financial drain for some, especially if you have more than one child attending school. If this is the case for your family, please contact the school administration to arrange a payment plan. We are more than willing to take post-dated cheque(s) if this may help.



Students are supplied with a school-fees form with their June report card and should return this form with their full fees in September. New students receive a fee form when registering for classes. All fees can be paid by cash or cheque, payable to “**Lord Asquith School**” and submitted to the homeroom teacher or office. We are not able to perform credit card, debit or e-transfer transactions.

## **Exam Rules and Regulations**

- Morning exams start at 9:00 a.m.; afternoon exams start at 1:00 p.m.
- Students cannot leave their seat for one hour after the start of the exam.
- Students writing departmental exams must stay for an hour and a half and may remain up to one half hour past normal stop time.
- No student can enter the exam room after 1 hour of the exam beginning unless previous arrangements have been made.
- NO cell phones or technological devices are allowed in the exam room UNLESS specified by the teacher.
- If you wish to leave the exam room for any reason, be prepared to have someone be with you.
- Any student missing a final exam will be given a 0 unless previous arrangements have been made.
- **All students in Grade 9 must have parental/guardian permission to leave the school after their exam.**
- **All students in Grades 10-12 are expected to leave the school upon completion of their exam unless the school has been otherwise instructed by the parent/guardian.**
- Hand in textbooks according to each subject teacher's request.

- **Be sure to have all textbooks returned and your locker cleaned out by the end of your last exam**

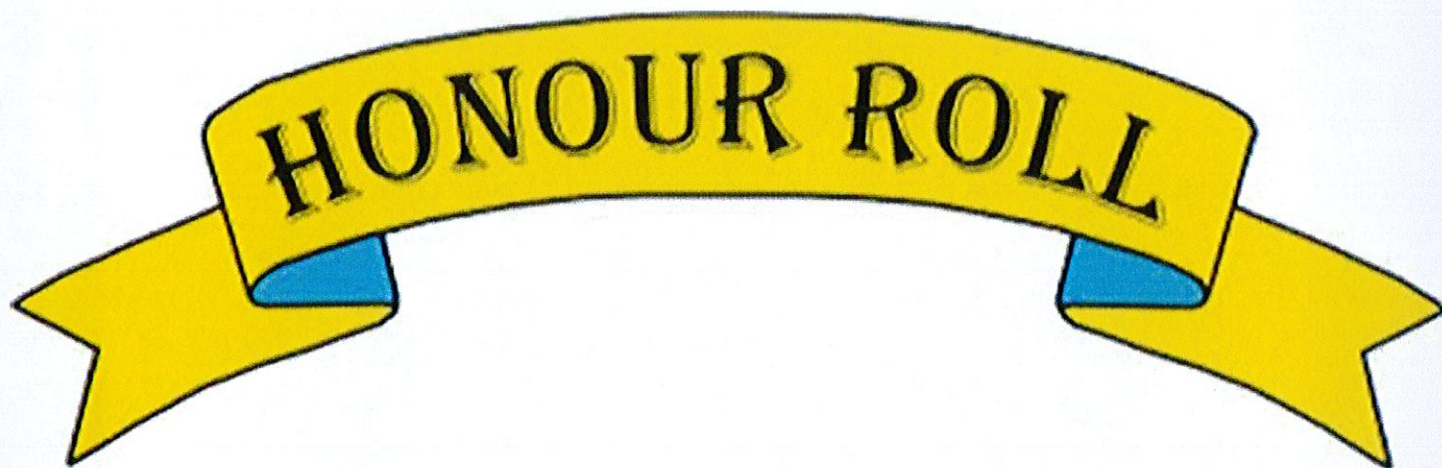

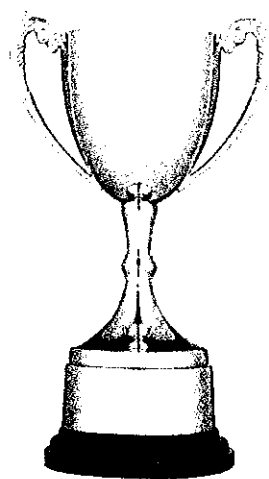

## ALLERGY AWARE



It's hard to believe that it's June already. Thanks to all the parents, students and staff for making Lord Asquith School peanut and tree nut aware. We really do appreciate you taking the time to read labels and being very careful of what comes to school. Thank you for helping keep our kids safe. We hope everyone has a great summer!!



## Information ALL Parents/Guardians Should Know:

1. At the start of each school year, parents should inform school authorities, both verbally and in writing, (through use of the Medical Release/Dispensation of Medication Form on the Lord Asquith School website) of their child's medical needs, and the emergency action plans indicating what is necessary for a safe environment for their child.
2. Parents should provide two EpiPens®, and Benadryl to be used in case of a medical emergency. Any medication (including Benadryl) needs to have prescription labels on each of them with the proper medication inside.
3. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure that the medication intended for the child has not reached its "best before" or expiry date. Parents should document for themselves when their child's medication will expire during the school year and replace as necessary. Expired medications cannot be administered.
