



School Supplies/Fees for 2018-19 Outstanding 2017-18 School Fees

Remember: It is <u>mandatory</u> that all supplies be provided by the school for a fee for students from Grade K to 5. There will be <u>NO</u> opting out. Grades 6-12 students will be responsible for their own supplies purchase.

For Grades K-5, there will be 2 'payment' dates of before and on June 30th and <u>September 4th and after</u>, offering 2 different monetary increments, the last being the more expensive so get your fees in to the office early (before June 30th to save \$\$\$). The supply order will made on June 15th to ensure delivery and sorting before September 4th.
