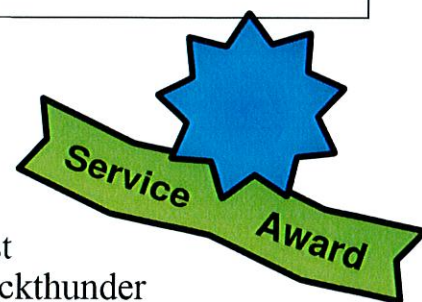

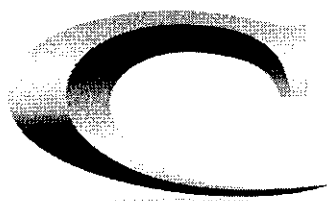

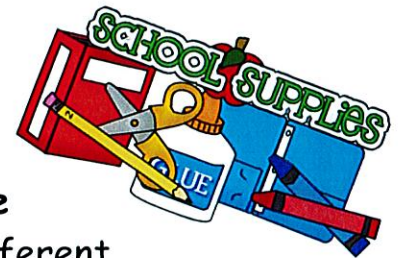

School Supplies/Fees for 2018-19 Outstanding 2017-18 School Fees

Remember: It is mandatory that all supplies be provided by the school for a fee for students from Grade K to 5. There will be **NO** opting out. Grades 6-12 students will be responsible for their own supplies purchase.



For Grades K-5, there will be 2 'payment' dates of **before and on June 30th** and **September 4th and after**, offering 2 different monetary increments, the last being the more expensive so get your fees in to the office **early (before June 30th to save \$\$\$)**. The supply order will be made on June 15th to ensure delivery and sorting before September 4th.

Also, a reminder to those families who have yet to pay their 2017-18 school fees: The amount owing for 2017-18 will be added to your 2018-19 fees. Please remit as soon as possible before June 30th.

This year, LAS had another strong showing at Track & Field. At the Conference Meet, we sent 50 athletes and as a team came in 7th in total points out of the 14 schools that were present. Of our 50 athletes, 33 returned the following week for the District Meet. To qualify for Districts, an athlete must finish in the top 8 in their event. After the District Meet, we had seven athletes qualify for Provincials. Qualifying for Provincials requires the athlete to place 1st or 2nd in their event.
