



# Allergy Aware

At Lord Asquith School we do not allow anything with peanuts or any kind of tree nut at school. Thank you for keeping our children with life threatening allergies safe.

Doing your Christmas baking and want a peanut-free option? Try these cookies!

#### **Peanut-Free Blossom Cookies**

#### **Ingredients**

½ cup shortening

34 cup SunButter

1/3 cup sugar

1/3 cup firmly packed light brown sugar

1 egg

2 Tbsp. milk

1 tsp. vanilla

1 ½ cup flour

1 tsp. baking soda

½ tsp. salt

1 package of Milk Chocolate Kisses



#### **Instructions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 375° F and unwrap the milk chocolate kisses.
- 2. Beat shortening and SunButter in large bowl until well-blended. Add 1/3 cup sugar and brown sugar; beat until fluffy. Add the egg, milk and vanilla; beat well.
- 3. In a separate bowl, stir together flour, baking soda and salt. Gradually beat into SunButter mixture.
- 4. Shape the dough into 1" balls. Roll in sugar then place on an ungreased cookie sheet.
- 5. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned. Immediately press an unwrapped milk chocolate Kiss into the center of each cookie (cookie will crack around edges). Remove from sheet to wire rack and let cool completely.


Dental Screening Notice Grade 1 & 7


