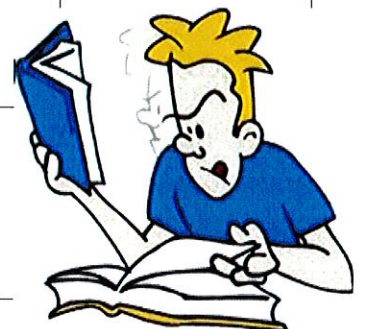

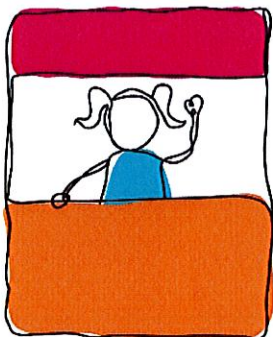


**Don't Forget!**

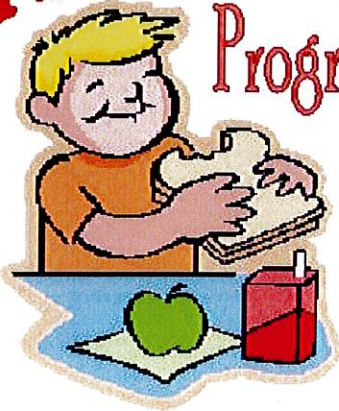

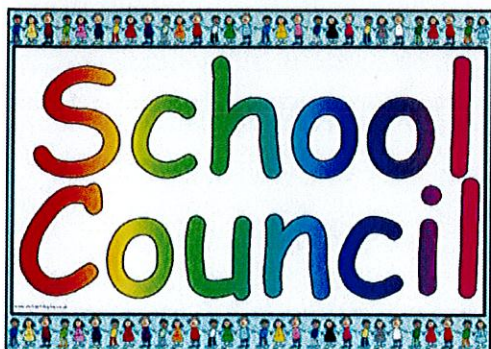
### Basketball at LAS

# **Take the Bite Out of Winter**

## **Public Health Services**

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Frostbite occurs with prolonged exposure or unprotected skin to very cold temperatures.

### **What to do to prevent frostbite ...**

- dress appropriately before going out in cold weather

### **Signs of frostbite ...**

- area is white or grey in colour and cold to touch
- frostbitten part will be numb
- severe frostbite causes tissue damage

### **What to do if frostbite occurs ...**

- apply gentle but firm pressure against the frostbitten part with a warm hand
- provide a hot drink to warm the body all over
- never rub the frostbitten area (rubbing can damage skin)
- seek medical help if serious



# **Play Safe in the Snow**

## **Public Health Services**

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Now that the snow is here, children are anxious to go tobogganing and sledding. Serious injuries, even deaths, have occurred among children enjoying these pastimes.

### **Tips to reduce the risk of injury ...**

**S**now should be packed but not icy

**L**ong flat slope should be used to slow down the sled

**E**xamine the area to avoid hazards and traffic

**D**ress warmly

**D**o not sled head first or standing up

**I**ncline of hill should not be steep

**N**o trailing scarves, mitten cords or loose clothing. Drawstrings on hoods and coats tied securely. Wear a bicycle helmet

**G**ood condition of sled is important – no loose parts, jagged edges or splinters




