Things to Note:

- Lifetouch will NOT be doing any class or staff groups due to COVID-19 guidelines.
- They will **not** be using any props in their photography programs.
- Lifetouch staff will be wearing masks all day while in schools.
- The photography program and flow is designed as "no touch" and students/staff will not need to touch anything.
- Students/staff should **NOT** bring anything to the photo session: **NO waterbottles,** books or cell phones. No jackets or articles of clothing that need to be removed before pictures, like hats.
- There will be NO "student helpers" to assist with photographs.
- Those students wearing masks are required to wear them to the photo session and will be asked to remove it prior to their picture.

Prairie Spirit Bus Policy Change:

Starting this school year, a bus route that is cancelled in the morning due to extreme cold <u>WILL RUN</u> in the afternoon, if conditions have improved. Bus routes cancelled at 6 AM due to cold weather will operate on their regular routes at the end of the school day provided that temperatures report at **12 NOON** are warmer than -40 degree Celsius (combined temperature/windchill). If the bus will run at the end of the school day, parents will receive notifications through the **Versatrans**

MyStop app and the update will be posted on the Division's website and phone hotline (306-683-2805).

Educational tours and/or extra-curricular travel by bus will operate in the afternoon provided that temperatures reported at **11 AM** are warmer than - 40 degrees Celsius (combined temperature/windchill).



Wheelchair lift equipment will be operational in the afternoon if the combined temperature is above -35 degrees Celsius at **12 noon**. The driver will contact the student's family if the lift equipment is operating for the afternoon route.


