

Another year of track and field has been completed. It has been a fun, exciting, and a very successful season.

On May 18, thirty-eight Osler athletes competed at the Conference meet at Griffiths Stadium in Saskatoon. Of those thirty-eight athletes, twenty four finished in the top eight, which advanced them to the District meet held on May 26. Two of our relay teams advanced as well.

There were many successes again at the District meet, along with many personal bests. Three grade nine girls, Trinty W., Kaitlyn T., and Autumn C., did so well that they advance to Provincials and represented Central Valley in Saskatoon on June 2 and June 3.
