

HAND HELD DEVICES NOT NEEDED AT SCHOOL

Osler School staff supports relieving our elementary students from the burdens and anxieties associated with cell phone use and connectivity.

We see value in teaching responsible use of handheld technology. Therefore, our Grade 9 teachers will manage technology within their own classrooms and at recess and noon hour according to their professional discretion. Use of cell phones will be restricted to the Grade 9 classroom and when invited by their teacher; however, non-negotiables include no use of social media and respect for the privacy of all.
