Biggar RCMP encourage families going away on winter vacations to be diligent in safe-guarding their properties from break enter and thefts. Biggar RCMP highest rate of such crime occurred between February to April. As well, nearly half of all reported property crime occurred between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. Be viailant all year but take extra precautions during these peak periods. Maintain and service your alarm systems, think about installing a high quality camera system, secure your home and all out buildings, put vour lights on timers, have someone checking your property, leave a vehicle parked out and have it moved every so often, ensure motion lights are functioning properly. Rural families should also ensure all yard lights are

working and shining toward points of entry. You can take all the precautions you want but if the basics are not covered off i.e.) valuables left in vehicles, vehicles unlocked, keys left in vehicles, buildings not locked, you are setting yourself up to be a victim of property crime. Nearly all thefts of vehicles or from vehicles in 2015 at Biggar jurisdiction was a direct result of owner negligence.
