
Prairie Spirit progress reports for Grade 1 - 9 students now use a learning progression scale to report student progress.



# Prairie Spirit learning goal: First Nations and Métis Achievement

At its regular meeting on Monday, December 1, the Prairie Spirit Board of Education received a planning, implementing and monitoring report on the Division's First Nations and Métis (FNM) Education Plan from Learning Superintendent, Kim Beaulieu.

Beaulieu describes the First Nations and Métis Education plan as "working to ensure we are creating learning environments that are caring and rigorous for all students." The Division's First Nations and Métis Achievement learning goal is:

#### First Nations/Métis achievement

By June 2016, the graduation rate for self-declared First Nations and Metis students graduating within three years of starting Grade 10 will increase by 25%.

The FNM Education Plan is focused on four areas:

- Adult learning Staff and administrators from Leask Community School, kihiw waciston School (Muskeg Lake),
  Blaine Lake Composite School and Stobart Community
  School are meeting to collaborate and share expertise.
- Building resources and supports for teachers FNM resources are being added to the Division's Resource Centre.
- 3. **Gathering resources** Two applications for provincial Invitational Shared Services Initiative (ISSI) grants have been submitted, one in partnership with Muskeg Lake Cree Nation and the other with Beardy's and Okemasis First Nation.
- 4. **Building relationships with our FNM partners** Ongoing relationship-building conversations are planned with Muskeg Lake, Beardy's and Okemasis and Mistawasis.

First Nations and Métis graduation rates in Prairie Spirit are well above the provincial FNM average. "We have data that shows this work is having an impact," Beaulieu explained.

Muskeg Lake Chief, Cliff Tawpisin Jr., was also in attendance at the Board meeting. Chief Tawpisin thanked Prairie Spirit for the good work that's being done with Muskeg Lake students.

#### Board requests more relocatable classrooms

At its November 24 meeting, the Board approved the submission of an application for six new relocatable classrooms for Prairie Spirit schools:

- Valley Manor—three relocatables (20 relocatables already added to this school)
- Warman Elementary—two relocatables (13 relocatables already added to this school)
- Venture Heights—one relocatable (seven relocatable classrooms already added to the school)

The Ministry will announce funding for relocatable class-rooms in the new year.

#### Successful PSS Foundation Launch

The Board expressed appreciation for the successful launch of the Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation. The launch event was held on November 20 at Division Office in Warman.

The Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation has been created to encourage and facilitate community and corporate support and involvement in public education. The funds raised through this charitable Foundation will be used to enhance learning opportunities for the students of Prairie Spirit School Division.

#### School reports: Borden and Langham Elementary

Dean Broughton, Principal of Borden School, and Laura Prefontaine, Principal of Langham Elementary School, provided reports about their schools to the Board.

Borden School has just under 100 students in Kindergarten to Grade 12. The school has a high rate of students attending post-secondary education and succeeding in their studies. The graduation rate has been 100% for the past two years.

The school is planning to pilot an online portfolio program to share student learning with parents. The school also holds a successful learning fair each year, along with the SCC.

"This is great work," said Larry Pavloff, Board Chair. Trustee Ken Crush described the school as a "family school". "Everyone gets a chance to be a leader and play on the sports teams at Borden School," he explained.

Langham Elementary has 168 students in Kindergarten through Grade 5, with enrolment steadily growing. For the past two years, the school has focused on improving reading skills. Now the focus is on effective writing.

"I'm really proud of the work of our staff and our students," Prefontaine said, noting that all students improved in reading last year and the expectation is for strong results this year as well. "Laura works hard at building the school community," said Trustee Crush in thanking Prefontaine for her leadership at the school. Pavloff commended the school for its patience during the disruption of extensive construction at the school at the end of the last school year.

#### **Board Organizational meeting**

The Board held its annual organizational meeting on Monday, November 24. The Board elected Larry Pavloff as Chair for his fifth one-year term, while Sam Dyck returned as Vice-Chair, a position he's held since 2008. The Board also confirmed Trustee membership in Board and Staff committees.
