2019 - 2020 Progress Reports

Progress Reports for students at Pike Lake School will be sent to parents at the culmination of this school year. We will be providing two progress reports, our regular progress report which will report on student learning and growth from September 2019 through March 13, 2020 and a second progress report specifically designed to report on supplemental learning from April through June 2020. Important information to note:

• All students in Kindergarten through Grade 9 will advance to the next grade level.

• Grades on the Supplemental Learning Progress Report will be carried over from the regular progress report unless their is sufficient additional evidence obtained through supplemental learning to increase the grade.

• Supplemental Learning grades cannot be lower than they were when the indefinite suspension of school occurred

<u>'In My Own Backyard'</u>



Mrs. Dutka: I'm very happy to be able to spend lots of time in my garden! My favourite part is picking out all the weeds.




Ms. Picard: Above: Where I go walking everyday. Side: Enjoying a fire on my deck
