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Dear Pike Lake Families,

We've had three great weeks of learning, reconnecting, and building new relationships at Pike Lake School. Many of the uncertainties we had in August have been replaced with healthy routines and updated information. The students are doing a great job of remembering to wear their masks when they can't distance, and to sanitize their hands and workspaces throughout the day. Some things look different this year, but Pike Lake School continues to be a natural place to learn. We've taken many opportunities to take our learning outside. An abundance of ladybugs has prompted exploration for the K, Gr.1 and Gr.2 students, while the Gr.3 and Gr.4 students have been investigating the properties of soil found around the school yard.
