

A couple of our new raised garden beds will be dedicated to growing native plants as well as plants that were used for medicinal purposes.

Below are just a few examples of native plants that can still be used for food and medicine:

Wild Fruit Trees: Saskatoons, Chokecherry, Raspberries

Strawberries, Buffaloberry, Blueberry

Medicinal Plants: Plantain, Sage, Stinging Nettle, Yarrow,

Wild Rose, Willow, Tansy, Wild Onion,

Cattails, Blue/Green Lichen
