Last Day and Progress Reports

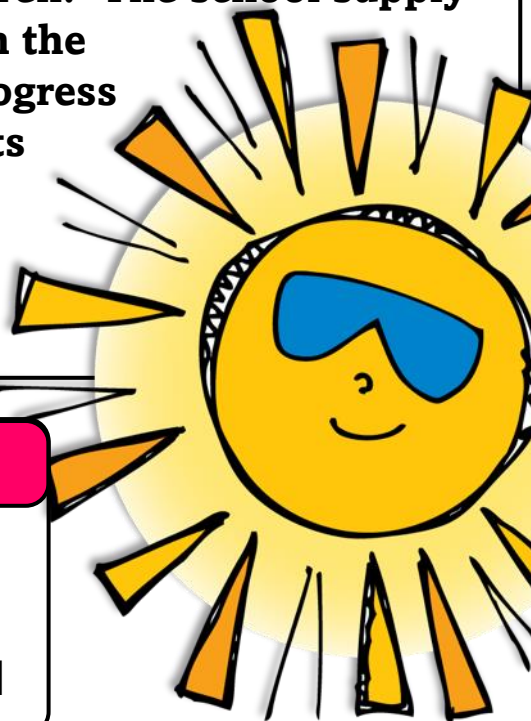
