**RE:** Resuming services of the **HEALTH BUS** on Oct 4, 2022

**The Health Bus will be resuming services Tuesday, Oct 4, 2022!** We had closed in April of 2020 due to COVID-19 and are now re-opening with new hours and a new location!

We value our relationship with our community partners and anticipate this service may be a support to some of your clients. Please spread the word to staff and clients.

### Where

The Health Bus will be located at the old shuttle stop in front of St Paul's Hospital main entrance. Parking is limited to street parking and paid parking within the paid parking lot.

### When

1pm-4:30pm SEVEN (7) days/week.

*\*Please note that services may be unavailable unexpectedly due to mechanical issues, staffing issues, and/or inclement weather.*

### Who

Anyone who does not have a primary care provider with a special emphasis on those heading to ED for non-urgent issues.

### Why

By parking in front of St Paul's Hospital, we can see patients needing non-emergency medical care before they go into the Emergency Room in hopes to divert non-urgent traffic away from the emergency department.
