- Al—teachers are currently doing courses in privacy training as it relates to Artificial Intelligence
- Government cell phone policy—little change for us—just the bus change
- Division is piloting a new literacy assessment program for 1-3 called Acadience, so staff are currently doing training
- PAA—grade 7 and 8 have the opportunity to do 4 blocks of home ec, construction, financial literacy, theatre studies, wildlife management, photography, coding rotations throughout the year
- Facilities
- Roof repairs
- Staff room back in use
- Gym floor was "relined", but it didn't go as well as we had hoped—we were able to add badminton and basketball lines that align with middle years sports

- Portable will be ready in the next day or so—it's similar to the one we got last year, with a large hallway and boot racks
- o Ramp being added to new portable
- Doors and hallways have been a little busy as we're down to the 2 entrances (plus k door) while there's been a lot of construction
- We've been approved for a K-12 School—division is currently working with the ministry and province to assess what that looks like—the election may throw off the time frame, but we're hoping to have clearer plans over the next 6 months
- Playground feedback and next steps—see proposal
- Schedule Change—how's it going
  - Construction and the gym has impacted things moderately
  - Morning recess—a bit later and snack is a little more rigorous, but mostly business as usual
  - Noon recess—students seem to be enjoying having more space for sports and the older students are appreciating more access to the playground and forest area (which were a little dominated by the littles!) and we anticipate the hill will be a big hit with more access in the winter months (each class previously got about 3 recesses/week)
  - Outdoor Learning Time in the afternoon—a variety of activities are occurring during this time,—cooperative games, outdoor ed challenges, sports, walks, social learning activities, connections to curricular areas like PE, math, art, ELA, etc. Between PE class being outdoors, some rainy weather, and the learning curve of the new schedule, I don't think we've hit our stride yet, but it's still pretty early in the year and we have a good start. Stu is doing some tracking so we can share more concrete data at another SCC meeting.
- Care partners and assemblies—we're in our second year of the school-wide initiative and things are going well--monthly themes follow the planner themes—students rotate through care partner activities each month (cooperative games, walk and talk, buddy reading, partner activity like a craft)
- ERPP—Emergency planning happens throughout September
- School goals—Math (percent/ratio/decimals), new literacy assessment initiative, self-regulation, "Complexity" Learning time
- School budget—not released yet
