We want to ensure that we are championing Prairie Spirit School Division and continue to advocate in ways that we can.

- The Prairie Spirit Board of Education had invited the Minister of Education and local MLAs to attend a meeting with the Board on October 23.
- Jeremy Cockrill, Minister of Education, Terry Jenson, MLA Martensville-Warman, Delbert Kirsch, MLA Batoche and Dana Skoropad, MLA Armriver attended the meeting and had an engaging discussion with the Board about a number of current issues in education in Saskatchewan. Also in attendance was Carol Lafond from Muskeg Lake Cree Nation. We were pleased that she was able to attend.

We continue to advocate for our Division and build relationships to help us move forward.

The Board's strategic plan also has a focus on strengthening foundational skills in mathematics, reading and writing. At it's October 23rd meeting, the Board received an update on the Division's work in the area of reading.

We know that strong reading skills provide the foundation needed for learning in all subject areas at every grade level. Targeted and intentional reading supports will have an impact throughout the student's time in school and extend into adulthood.

- Prairie Spirit students in Grades 1 6 who are reading below grade level will have a specific reading support plan created for them during 2023/24.
- Prairie Spirit is piloting a new reading assessment in seven schools this year, with plans to expand to all schools in the next few years.
