# Protect Your Child with FREE Immunization



## Students NEW to Saskatchewan and or from a First Nations Community

Public Health *requires* an immunization record to decide if your child needs vaccine to be fully protected.

You need to bring the record to a Public Health office (listed below) **OR** to the school. When you give the record to the school, this will be your consent for the school to collect the record and give it to Public Health. The school will not keep a copy.

Students in grades 1, 6 and 8 will be immunized in school.

 Parents will be informed by letter and asked to sign a consent before the nurse gives the vaccines.

# If you have children under 5 years

Book an appointment at a public health office or come to a drop-in clinic. We can arrange for your child's record to be translated. We can immunize your child without a Saskatchewan health services card.



# **Updating Your Child's Vaccinations**

Children in Canada receive the following free vaccines:

#### 2 months to 18 months

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio, Haemophilus B

• 4 doses

Pneumococcal 13

• 3 doses

Meningococcal C

1 dose

Measles, Mumps, Rubella and Varicella

• 2 doses

Rotavirus

• 2 doses

#### 4 to 6 Years

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio

1 dose

#### Grade 6

Hepatitis B

• 2 doses

**Human Papillomavirus** 

• 3 doses for girls only Meningococcal A,C,Y,W 135

1 dose

#### Grade 8

Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis

1 dose

#### 6 months and older

 Seasonal influenza available from October to March

## How do I book an appointment for my child?

- Call a public health office and tell them you are new to Canada.
- We will find a clinic close to where you live.

#### Parent checklist

- Come to your appointment on time.
- If possible drop off your child's immunization record 2 weeks prior to appointment to be translated *OR* bring all records to the appointment.
- Bring your child's Saskatchewan health services card if you have one. We will immunize even if you don't have a card.
- Bring documents that show your child's name and date of birth, such as a
  passport or a permanent residency card.
- A parent or legal quardian must come to the appointment with the child.
- Bring someone with you who can read and understand English. We can contact a translator if needed.
