A) Warman High School Scholarship – Application deadline is May 15.

See WHS website under the Grad Tab. Warman businesses contribute to this scholarship fund. Students submit ONE application to be considered for all scholarships.

- **Engineering is May 1**

- Applicants are encouraged to apply early since class registration opens in June.

Supporting documents and transcripts are usually due 15 days after admission deadline.

E) SaskPolytech

1) Admission deadlines

A) Most programs are FQFA

The First Qualified/First Admitted (FQFA) process is used for the majority of Saskatchewan Polytechnic programs. When we determine that you meet the program's admission requirements, you will be offered admission based on the date you fully qualify for the program. The earlier you provide the appropriate documents and information that qualify you for admission to the next intake, the earlier you might begin your studies. Your application, once qualified, is always considered for the next intake

B) High Demand Programs application deadline is Feb 15.

High Demand Programs include: Dental Hygiene, Medical Laboratory Technology, Medical Radiologic Technology and Practical Nursing

F) Apprenticeship

There are two ways to become a journey person in Saskatchewan

1) Pre-employment Training

Students can enroll in any of the trades programs (typically at SaskPolytech) to start the journey of working toward their papers when they register with Saskatchewan Apprenticeship. The time spent in the program is credited toward the number of hours needed to become a journey person. After the course is completed (16-30 weeks depending on the trade), the student finds a job with a journey person in that trade who will then sign off on the hours and allow the student to attend additional

training at SaskPoly throughout the next years. Typically, most trades require about 4 years of combined on the job training and schooling to become a journeyman. A final examination is required.

2) On the job Training.

Students able to find a job with a journeyman in the trade of their choice can register with Saskatchewan Apprenticeship. The journeyman will sign off on their hours and allow the student to attend training at SaskPoly throughout the next years. Typically, most trades require about 4 years of combined on the job training and schooling to become a journeyman. A final examination is required.
