# School Access Plan

We have been monitoring the safe and efficient flow of students to and from our school and the Legends Centre facility. Overall, things have gone smoothly in the first days, but would ask that you review the following and discuss with your children as needed.

- 1. A reminder that students should not arrive at school before 8:45am.
- 2. Students riding bikes, skateboards and scooters to school are asked to park them upon arrival. School staff and Legends staff have had to remind some students about not biking, skateboarding, etc. in the Legends Centre parking lot adjacent to bussing lanes. School and city staff ask that students not be biking or skateboarding in the parking



lot at lunch time whether they have permission to be off campus or not. This is a hazard for the students and our bus drivers.

- 3. Parents picking up/dropping off students are asked to do so on Gowan Road or areas to the west of the school. Please do not make arrangements to have your student meet/find you in the Legends Centre parking lot. Students darting between buses and wandering around in the Legends Centre parking lot are putting themselves in a hazardous situation.
- 4. Students have generally been doing a good job of using pathways through the park, using sidewalks and crosswalks. We are appreciative to the City of Warman for improvements they have made to signage and zoning along Centennial Blvd. Our staff has been monitoring the intersection of Centennial and Clubhouse and will continue to do so in the coming weeks. We are also appreciative of RCMP and City of Warman Bylaw Enforcement for assisting us in monitoring this area. We ask for parent/guardian assistance in reviewing pedestrian safety with your children.

# Warman Community Library Update

Hello from Warman Community Library! Although we are not yet up and running, we are looking forward to having students access books in the upcoming weeks. We are also looking forward to becoming a joint-facility with the Wheatland Regional Library in late October or early November.

For now, we are asking that all students obtain a Wheatland Regional Library card to access the library. We have sent forms home with each student, and are asking that they be returned as soon as possible. If your child already has their own library card, simply fill in their name and library barcode number and sign the section that grants us permission to keep a copy of their card on



file (so they don't need to bring their card to school every day). If your child does not have a card, please fill in the complete form. Eventually, the Wheatland Library staff will need to confirm proof of address with parent ID. We will hope to get this done on student-parent-teacher interview night in November, and more information will be sent out at that time.

As the teacher-librarian, I look forward to getting to know students through working in classrooms and through visits to the library. I also plan to run book clubs and library clubs once our facilities allow for it! Stay tuned for more updates as things change at a very rapid pace!
