It is amazing to hear students tell you about their 'schema' on a particular topic or how their stamina is growing. Students will routinely tell about a connection they are making, an inference they are drawing or telling what the most important information is. We have much to be proud of as we continue our literacy journey.




Reading Party

Communications Protocol for Parents/ Guardians

Tell Them From Me Survey

Warman Community Middle School will be participating in an online school survey for students – *Tell Them From Me* (TTFM) during the last part of November. TTFM is an online survey that allows students to give their feedback and share their voice on their school environment, experiences at school, and any school improvement programs. During the last two weeks of November, all students will be given the opportunity and time to participate in this survey during regular school

hours. They are encouraged to complete the survey, but may choose not to as it is completely voluntary. Students who agree to complete the survey will be given a random username and password to access and complete the survey. Students' names cannot be linked to their responses which allows it to be completely anonymous. Results will show all student scores combined together – it is not possible to single out individual students in the results.

The student survey will be completed electronically and will require approximately 35-40 minutes to complete.



The student survey measures include such topics as emotional and social well-being, physical health, and behaviours and attitudes linked to student success. The survey also allows students to give their thoughts and feedback in open-ended question responses.

TTFM was created by The Learning Bar, based on the work by Dr. J. Douglas Willms. Dr. Willms is widely known nationally and internationally for his work on educational monitoring systems, including the Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. Since 2004, Tell Them From Me has quickly grown to become Canada's largest nation-al school survey.

Remembrance Day Ceremony

Cold and Inclement Weather

As we prepare for winter-type weather, the school plan for cold and inclement weather as shared in the school handbook is reprinted here for your convenience: We believe that students benefit from and enjoy active time outdoors, but also hold student safety as a top priority. We use Environment Canada's Warman forecast to obtain our information.

We use -25 degrees Celsius as a guideline to determine whether we will send students outside or not at recess. Minus 25 degrees and warmer students will normally be sent outdoors for recess breaks.

When the temperature with wind-chill factor falls between



-26 and -30 degrees Celsius, children will be expected to spend a shortened recess outdoors responsive to the specific weather conditions being experienced.

When the temperature with wind -chill factor is -31 degrees Celsius or colder, students will be required to remain indoors at recess breaks.

Should a student's medical condition require him/her to temporarily stay indoors, the parent should notify the homeroom teacher. Students should always come to school with proper cold weather attire, regardless of the season.

Lost & Found

On the upcoming Conference Days on November 3rd and 5th, please remember to check the lost and found items located on the tables in the front foyer of the school. Any unclaimed items will be donated to Good Will.

After School Transitions From School to Home

School staff are on supervision at the end of the school day for 15 minutes to help transition students from the school day to home. It is our expectation that students are going home or to afterschool care promptly following dismissal at 3:19pm.

In some cases when the weather is nice, students report that they have permission to play in the park for a time period that extends beyond the 15 minutes after the school day when staff are providing supervision.

In these situations it is important for all to understand that children are no longer under the supervision or responsibility of the school. In these cases parents should work with their children to develop a safety plan in the event they encounter an injury or problem with another child, and organize supervision of these afterschool activities in the city park as they deem prudent.

Updating Your Contact Information

A reminder to call the school office and notify our administrative assistants if you have any changes to your personal/contact information.

We rely on this information to be up to date and accurate in a case of emergency when we may need to contact a parent/guardian.



Nut Alert!

Nut allergies can be life threatening.


Even if your own child does not have a nut allergy, take time to teach your child some simple rules for when they are at school. This will help keep all children safe!

Simple rules to teach your child for school:

Eating or breathing in:

- Don't share food.
 Only eat the food that is made for you!
- Don't share things that can have any food or drinks on them such as utensils, cups, bottles, or straws.

Touching things:





 Make sure you wash your hands long enough; sing a song that lasts about 30 seconds.

A quick snack idea that even your child can make for school:

Banana Tortilla Spirals

whole wheat tortilla
 thsp soy nut butter
sunflower seeds, shelled
raisins

1 banana, peeled

- Spread the soy nut butter on the tortilla.
- Sprinkle sunflower seeds and raisins over the nut butter.
- Place the banana on one edge of the tortilla.
- Roll up the banana tucking in the ends.
- Saran wrap and refrigerate for 30 minutes before slicing into bite size pieces. Yum!

Healthy Snack and Meal Ideas for School Family Nights

With school, work, meetings, and extra-curricular activities, it can be difficult to schedule time with your family. School family nights give opportunities to reconnect with your family in a fun-filled evening complete with tasty healthy meals or snacks that are easy to prepare!

Snack Ideas

- Raw vegetables with hummus (chickpea dip)
- Whole grain crackers topped with light cheddar cheese
- Cut up fruit with yogurt as a dip
- Plain popcorn sprinkled with parmesan cheese
- Fruit salsa with baked pita bread (see recipe below)
- Popsicles made with fruit and yogurt

Meal Ideas

- Quesadillas made with cheese, chopped vegetables, and beans
- Whole wheat pita pizzas with vegetables and cheese
- Baked chicken tenders with Tzatziki sauce and baked sweet potato "fries"
- Tuna salad sandwiches and vegetable kabobs
- Vegetable fajitas topped with cheese
- Hamburger soup with a whole wheat

Quick Tips

- Serve milk or water instead of pop or juice.
- Adding strawberries and lemon to water is a great way to boost the flavor!

Fruit Salsa Recipe

- 2 peaches, chopped
- 2 nectarines, chopped
- 4 kiwi, chopped
- 2 16oz containers of strawberries, chopped
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1/4 cup strawberry jam

Add all of the fruit to a large bowl, drizzle with lemon juice and jam and lightly fold.

Serve with baked pita

wedges sprinkled with cinnamon.
