

SCHOOL FUNDRAISER FOR EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAMS

FUNDSCRIP is back by popular demand! We will be kicking off our annual school-wide gift card fundraiser to support extra-curricular programs at WCMS on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>September 28</u>. We count on this fundraiser to support our school's many extracurricular programs. The proceeds of this fall fundraiser support the approximately \$10,000 annual expenses that allow WCMS students to participate in a variety of extra-curricular activities at no expense.

Fundscrip costs you nothing! By purchasing gift cards from FundScrip you can pay for everyday purchases that you already make. Every month you spend hundreds of dollars for things

like food, gas, clothing, pharmacy, restaurants, electronics, home renovations, department stores, and so on. All you have to do is pay for some or all of your purchases using gift cards bought at face value from Fund-Scrip participating retailers and a percentage of every gift card purchased is contributed back to WCMS. The program has over one hundred and seventy participating retailers, including popular local businesses like Extra Foods, A&W, Boston Pizza, Pizza Hut, Subway, and Canadian Tire. We encourage everyone to invite their family members, friends, co-workers and neighbors to participate in FundScrip as well. After all, they probably buy

WARMAN COMMUNITY LIBRARY

We are excited to kick off another school year in the Warman Community Library as students can take advantage of a wide variety of services and opportunities far beyond what any regular school library can provide, including:

- Extended library hours on evenings, weekends, and school breaks.
- Access to resources from across Saskatchewan's public library system.
- Online books and magazines that can be downloaded from anywhere to the student's device.
- A modern and comfortable space

Students must have their Wheatland Regional Library credentials with them to sign out materials from the library at any time other than whole class book exchanges. NEW!!!!! -We are excited to announce that we have partnered with the Warman Public Library to purchase digital card readers so students and all patrons of the Warman Community Library have three convenient ways to provide their library card:

- Library card
- Library key fob
- Digital photo of your library card on your electronic device

As users of the Warman Community Library, all student patrons are responsible for adhering to Wheatland Regional Library policies regarding overdue and lost materials. Students are issued a receipt with every resource they check out of the Warman Community Library. Checking on the status of an account can be conveniently done by visiting the library directly, calling the Warman Community Library at 306-933-4387 or logging on to

wheatland.sk.ca with your library card number. The pin number is defaulted to the last 4 digits of your phone number. WCMS students are charged fines in accordance with Wheatland Regional Libraries borrowing policies for overdue and missing books. Please check your child's account regularly to ensure they are returning books on time. You should receive emails from the library when your child's requested books come in or when their books are approaching the due date or are overdue. If you have not been receiving these messages, please check with the library staff to ensure we have the correct email address on record.

In the event that settling fines may present a financial hardship to the family, parents are encouraged to contact Greg Tebay, WCMS Principal to explore other options including volunteering or service projects to address the fines.

Dear Parent and/or Guardian:

Re: Community Threat Assessment and Support Protocol (CTASP)

Prairie Spirit School Division is committed to providing safe and caring learning environments in each of our schools.

As part of this commitment, Prairie Spirit works with other local school divisions and a variety of community organizations to put best safety and prevention procedures into place. This collaborative work, called the Community Threat Assessment and Support Protocol (CTASP), involves the entire community to support our safe schools and neighbourhoods.

As part of the protocol, we are committed to following established safety procedures in our schools. Whenever a student makes a significant threat to harm themselves or others, the school's Threat Assessment Team, comprised of school administrator, counsellor and School Resources Officer (RCMP/Police), will complete a threat assessment to determine the immediacy and the level of risk, in consultation with the Division's Safe Schools team. The purpose of the assessment is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behavior does not become hurtful or destructive.

The protocol facilitates sharing of information between community organizations (for example, the Ministries of Social Services, Education and Justice, as well as local police services and other organizations) when a student may pose a risk of violence towards themselves or others.

All of our principals and vice-principals, as well as many other school leaders, have benefited from training in this area called *Violence Threat Risk Assessment*. Because of our shared understanding and commitment to safety, we are well equipped to intervene and respond to a student in crisis.

We will continue to work with you and with our community partners to provide safe and caring schools for our students.
