#### **MYSTOP**

Prairie Spirit School Division is piloting a new app (iOS/Android) to Prairie Spirit families called **MyStop**. MyStop is available to students and parents for tracking their school bus. The app also provides additional benefits that allow transportation staff to send notifications to the app alerting of a bus

#### **BIKES AND SCOOTERS**

With warmer weather we will soon see students riding bikes and scooters to school. A few reminders:

- Bikes and scooters must be stored outside in the storage racks provided.
- Bikes and scooters should be locked up.
- Bikes, scooters, skateboards, etc. should be stored immediately upon arrival at school.
- Bikes, scooters, skateboards, etc. are not to be ridden at

recess breaks on the school grounds.



#### **ARRIVAL TIME AT SCHOOL**

With warmer temperatures and earlier sunrise we sometimes see students arriving at school very early in the morning. A reminder that the school opens (and supervision of students) starts at 8:20 AM and student doors are unlocked at this time. Students and

families are asked to plan for students' arrival between 8:20 and 8:35AM. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### **BUS LOADING ZONE/ACCESS PLAN REMINDER**

Did you know that WCMS services almost 360 urban and rural bus students daily? Getting students home safely and efficiently is a priority for us, and having a staff member on supervision in the bus loading area each morning and afternoon. Here is how you can help:

- 1. Make arrangements to pick up students with private vehicles on the Gowan Road (west) side of the school complex not in the Legends parking lot.
- 2. Students who are not riding the school bus, should not loiter in the bus loading zone in front of the Legends Centre.
- 3. Bikes, scooters, and skateboards should not be ridden in the bus loading area.
- 4. Students riding the school bus should line up in their bus queue and wait in an orderly fashion for the buses to arrive.

#### **CHOOSING BAND VS. DRAMA/DANCE/MUSIC**

At WCMS all students take Visual Art as part of the Arts Education curriculum. In addition, students/parents music select to take El-THER Band or Drama/Dance/Music program as the other component of Arts Education.

In late April/early May, we will be sending home information and asking students and their parents/ guardians to make a commitment to one program or the other at this time to assist us in planning staffing and timetabling for the upcoming school year. Students and parents/guardians need to carefully consider this choice and understand they are making a firm commitment to one of these programs for the upcoming year. It is not possible for students to switch from one program to the other after your choice for the vear has been made. To assist students and their parents/guardians in making an informed choice we want to provide a bit more information on each choice.

<u>Band:</u> A band program is a highly effective educational vehicle for developing musical abilities, understandings, and appreciations. Band classes allow students to directly experience the art of music and music making.

Students entering Grade 6 are strongly encouraged to give band a try for the year. It can be a wonderful experience, and it is very difficult for a student to try to join band in later years without other musical background or experience. While there is expectation to do some practicing at home if the student expects to become proficient in their instrument, the amount of time is flexible. Wheth-

er the student/family finds the task of some independent practice to be a motivating opportunity or not may inform whether the student wants to continue with band in subsequent years. How will you know unless you try?

There are some costs for families to rent an instrument for the student if they do not own one. We help organize rentals through St. John's Music and Long and McQuade in Saskatoon. Parents/ guardians can expect to pay about \$15 - \$50 per month for a rental (depending on the choice of instrument). The school does have a small collection of some instruments to support any student wishing to take band where financial hardship is a factor. In such cases, parents/guardians should contact the school administration for more information.

One of the exciting opportunities in joining band is to perform occasionally in the community and travel to local/regional music festivals.

Students and parents/guardians should be aware that after Grade 8 students can continue to take band at Warman High School for course credit towards Grade 12 graduation.

Instrument trials will take place over the next month during Music class time for all Grade 5 students where they will have a chance to try each band instrument. Once instrument tryouts are complete, students will have tried the flute, clarinet, alto and tenor saxes, trumpet, French horn, baritone, trombone, and tuba. Percussion is also a choice next year to play in band.

Students/families who choose Band for next year will have more information about choosing an instrument, and information about instrument rental and our Band program sent home.

Drama, Dance, Music (DDM):
Drama, dance, and music (DDM)
are the three other areas of the
arts education curriculum. The K12 aim of arts education is to enable students to understand and
value arts expressions throughout
life. The goals for arts education
consist of:

- · Cultural/historical (CH) students will investigate the content and aesthetics of the arts within cultural, historical and contemporary contexts and understand the connection between the arts and the human experience
- · Critical/responsive (CR) students will respond to artistic expressions of Saskatchewan, Canadian and International artists using critical thinking, research, creativity and collaborative inquiry
- Creative/productive (CP)
   students will inquire, create and communicate through dance, drama, music and visual art

Students taking DDM can expect to engage in a variety of activities related to the three perspectives above. Students may occasionally have homework in this course preparing or collecting materials for class or finishing assignments that have not been completed in class.
