Orange Shirt Day

Orange Shirt Day is recognized on September 30 each year and is part of a larger movement in the country to provide opportunity for First Nations, governments, schools and communities to unite in a spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come. The Orange Shirt Day movement is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, B.C., in 2013. It grew out of the account of a young girl having her new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the mission. Orange Shirt Day was first proclaimed in Saskatchewan in 2016, in response to a resolution passed by the province's trustees at the SSBA Spring General Assembly. According to its website, Orange Shirt Day is "an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in a spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come."

Frequently asked questions about COVID back to school safety

1. If my child gets sent home from school, when are they allowed to return?

We want families to follow the direction of 811, which is the first point of contact to get medical direction. We ask families to follow the direction of the Saskatchewan Health Authority. **Students are allowed to return to school 48 hours after symptoms free**.

2. What if my child has allergies?

If a student displays the symptoms consistent with COVID as listed in COVID-19 Protocols for AP-432 Illness in Care, all steps in the policy should be followed beginning with the child staying at home, or if the child is at school, parents being contacted to pick up their child, and instructed to call 811 and follow the directions of the Health Officials. At this time, this process should be followed by all students who display symptoms, regardless of whether we are told that the symptoms are a result of allergies or other conditions. School staff do not currently have discretion in this matter – if symptoms are noted, the procedures need to be followed. When the student with allergies returns to school, the school's reaction to any COVID-like symptoms will be based on the child – what we know about the child, what their allergies are like, if they've worsened – the student may not have to continue to be tested after the first negative test result.

3. What if my child becomes ill at home, what should I do?

We advise our families to keep your child at home, call 811 and follow the direction of the Saskatchewan health Authority. We also ask families to communicate with the school by either contacting child's teacher or main office to let us know. Students are allowed to return to school 48 hours after symptom free.

4. Are students required to wear masks all day?

Currently we are in Level 2 of the Provincial Safe Schools Plan. It states that if social distancing cannot be maintained, masks are required for students from grades 4-12. There may be situations were social distancing can occur (typically outdoors) where masks would not be required.

5. What are the symptoms schools are monitoring students for?

-fever - cough -headache -muscle/joint ache -chills -difficulty breathing -runny nose -nasal congestion -conjunctivitis -dizziness -fatigue

-nausea/vomiting
-diarrhea
-loss of appetite
-loss of sense of smell
-shortness of breath

IMMUNIZATION PLANS

In alignment with Public Health messaging, the Government of Saskatchewan supports immunization as the best way to protect children from many diseases. Immunization protects individuals, families and communities by preventing the spread of disease. In Saskatchewan, immunization programs for young children are provided by public health nurses through local public health clinics. For school-aged students, public health nurses may deliver immunizations in school settings. For more information please find more immunization resources on our website.

BE WISE AND IMMUNIZE

Immunization is the best way to protect children from many dangerous diseases. It protects individuals, families, and communities by preventing the spread of disease. It is important to keep infant and children's immunizations on time and up-to-date to provide the best protection. In Saskatchewan, immunization is provided through public health beginning at two months of age. Immunizations are given throughout the infant and preschool years as well as in Grades 6 and 8.

There are resources available to parents that can help answer immunization questions. These resources include:

- Caring for Kids <u>www.caringforkids.cps.ca</u>. This website from the Canadian Pediatric Society has a section on immunization. This site provides information on vaccines, vaccine safety, common concerns, myths and facts and general information regarding immunization.
- Kids Boost Immunity <u>www.kidsboostimmunity.com</u>. This resource is a free online learning resource for Canadian students with lessons linked to science, social studies and health curriculums. It is designed for teachers and their classroom students. By completing quizzes, students have the opportunity to earn vaccines for children through UNICEF Canada.
- I Boost Immunity <u>www.iboostimmunity.com</u>. This site provides information regarding immunization and communicable diseases by doing "Booster" quizzes. If the average score for a quiz is beaten, a vaccine is earned for a child in a developing country through UNICEF Canada.
- Immunize Canada <u>www.immunize.ca</u>. Immunize Canada provides information for the public regarding immunization, diseases and vaccines. There are sections for parents and adolescents who may be looking for more information.
- Information regarding Saskatchewan's immunization program is available at <u>Government of</u> <u>Saskatchewan Immunization Services</u>. This site includes information on the immunization programs, the immunization schedule and vaccine information.
