3C News

Our class has a lot to celebrate. First on the list are the wonderful people that make up our classroom community. It takes a lot of trust to be able to take the small risks learning often requires. The kind and supportive students that make up 3C have made taking risks and trying new things much easier. I always remind the kids that we have twenty-fout teachers in the room not just one! They have taken this responsibility seriously and have done a tremendous job of supporting each other's learning.

We have learned about many different interesting topics this year. In science, we learned about magnetism and static electricity, and structures and materials in the first part of the year. Now, we are learning about plants and will soon move on to learning about soils for the remainder of the year.

Our most recent Social Studies unit has focused on learning about the past and present culture and traditions of the Inuit. It has been interesting to see the students make connections and draw conclusions about how the land and climate where people live affects how they meet their needs. The students worked on creating a poster to demonstrate what they have learned about the Inuit. They did a great job of setting criteria for what a 'good' completed project would look like. They followed the criteria very well, and created many beautiful examples of grade three work.

In math, we recently wrapped up our addition and subtraction unit as well as a unit on geometry. Currently, we are learning about multiplication and division, and data analysis. We also hope to learn a little more about measurement and fractions before the school year comes to a close.

It is impossible to tell you about all of the learning journeys we have been on as 3C. I hope the little bit I have been able to share has given you a sense of what it is like to be a member of our classroom community. In the last couple of weeks we filled in fact cards with information on our specific animal, and now we are creating posters to share our learning with others.
